Testing Sound By Sight



PHIL SPITALNY, director of the popular "Hour of Charm" radio program, tries a novel studio rehearsal technique. A cathode-ray oscillograph permits him to "see" how music sounds.

With the oscillograph, which converts sound waves into patterns of light, Spitalny discovers that he can determine instantly whether his artists are properly grouped and placed at the right distances from the microphone, thus saving him much of the time and steps form-

erly spent in going back and forth between rehearsal studio and control room for check-ups on sound effects.

The photograph shows Spitalny, with a microphone suspended from his neck, examining the beam pattern of violin notes rendered by Evelyn, Lucille and Jennie, three members of the string section of his all-girl orchestra, heard on the "Hour of Charm" every Monday at 4:00 P. M. (E.S.T.) over NBC network, under sponsorship of dealers of the General Electric Company.
