SEEK BACKING FOR MINE DEVELOPMENT

#### WOULD FIND MARKET FOR TALCOSE MATERIALS

Processes perfec ed lately for commercial use of certain talcose minerals may provide a market for the product of a deposit identified as pyrophyllite, a low-grade alumina silicate found in American canyou ni Pershing county.

Prospectors have identified the material merely as talc, a classification to which generally they apply all talcose and kaolinized-vein contents, usually found as selvage or "gouge" along vein walls. Tests were said to prove the Pershing county deposit to be of a quality useless for such purposes as the manufacture of spark plugs, but applicable for highest-type marble finish in building construction. -Nevada State Journal.
