

Indian Colony Chamber Worry

Meat Patties Down Pat

To make uniform meat patties, pat out ground meat mixture to desired thickness on waxed paper, then cut with biscuit cutter.

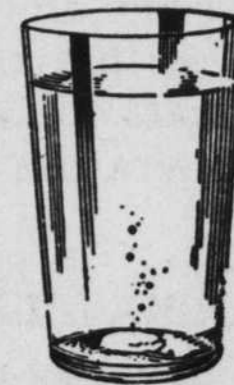
