## Making Camp At Charleston Park

Forest Ranger R. C. Anderson reports that there was a flurry of sleety hail at Charleston Park last Wednesday morning and that the weather was cold.

There are about 35 CCC boys at the camp engaged in repairing buildings where roofs were caved in by the snow and putting the camp in repair for a large group which will spend the summer there.

Work will be prosecuted vigorously on the new Deer Creek road this summer, and the present road to Deer Creek is in good condition, according to Mr. Anderson.

A grazing survey is being started with the object of conserving the forage of the mountain area.

The pipe line from Little Falls to the camp is still frozen, and it has been necessary to ship in about half a mile of new pipe which is being used for a temporary line.

One result of the exceptionally cold weather is the partial eradication of the pine beetles which have been killing many trees in the Forest Reserve, according to Mr. Anderson.

## Heavy Snowfall Delays Opening

Considerable difficulty is being experienced in opening the water systems for the public camp grounds at Charleston Park, because of the exceptionally heavy snow accumulations during the past winter.

It was necessary to dig through 34 feet of snow last week to reach the intake for the pipeline which supplies the summer homes, the CCC camp and the ranger station.

Opening of the pipe line to the Kyle Canyon camp in Charleston Park was exceptionally difficult. So much more water than the normal flow is coming over Little Falls that it was impossible to get beneath the falls to turn the valves until after most of the water had been diverted above the falls by means of a temporary flume line.

The pipe line at Deer Creek is expected to be as deeply covered as that at Charleston Park, but will be opened as soon as possible.

All indications point to a very favorable summer at the mountain resorts with ample water for all needs.
