# **Court Proposal**


What is considered by many as an epochal event in American politics and government and which may be the pivotal point upon which hinges the future of the nation, is the majority report of the judiciary committee of the United Stat s senate on the so-called "court reform" proposal of the administration.


What is particularly significant is the fact that Nevada's junior senator, Hon. P. A. McCarran, long known as one of the "liberal" political leaders of the state, is credited in a large measure with the authorship of the report.

Following is a summary of the report. It is worthy of careful reading by every thoughtful person:

"We recommend the rejection of this bill as a needless, futile, and utterly dangerous abandonment of constitutional principle.

"It would not banish age from the bench nor abolish divided decisions.

"It would not affect the power of any court to hold laws unconstitutional nor withdraw from any judge the authority to issue injunctions.

"It is proposed without precedent and without justification.

"It would subjugate the courts to the will of congress and the President and thereby destroy the independence of the judiciary, the only certain shield of individual rights.

"It contains the germ of a system of centralized administration of law that would enable an executive every judicial district in the land to sit in judgment on controversies between the government and the citizen.

"It points the way to the evasion of the Constitution and establishes the method whereby the people may upon all amendments of the fundamental law.

"It stands now before the country, acknowledged by its proponents as a plan to force judicial interpretation of the Constitution, a proposal that violates every sacred tradition of American democracy.

"Under the form of the Constitution it seems to do that which is unconstitutional.

to make this government one of men rather than one of law, and its practical operation would be to make the Constitution what the executive or legislative branches of the government choose to say it is -an interpretation to be changed with each change of administration. "It is a measure which should be so emphatically rejected that 11s parallel will never again be presented to the free representatives of the free people of America."


### JEFFERSON'S EPITAPH

Thomas Jefferson's dominating trait was his love of liberty, and it was as a champion of human freedom that he desired to be known to posterity. This was illustrated by his epitaph, written by himself for inscription upon his tomb:

"Here is buried Thomas Jefferso minded to send his judges into son, author of the Declaration of Independence, and of the statutes of Virginia for religious freedom, and father of the University of Virginia."

No reference is made to his services as governor of Virginia, member of congress, minister to France, be deprived of their right to passisecretary of state, vice-president and twice president of the United States. In his own estimation his services in the cause of liberty stood above all these.

Freedom of government, freedom of education, were the paramount objectives of his life, as epitomized in his epitaph. Born an aristocrat, Thomas Jefferson became the ardent defender of the masses and one of the greatest exponents of human lib-"Its ultimate operation would be erty the world has ever known.
