

New High School For Winnemucca

Plans are being discussed for a new Humboldt county high school building at Winnemucca, according to the announcement of Chairman Morrison of the school board, in The Humboldt Star.

Tentative plans under preparation by F. J. DeLangechamps, Reno architect, include both a new building to cost about \$150,000, and plans for remodeling the present building at a cost of about \$80,000, Dr. Morrison said.

Although, he said, board members plan to invite chamber of commerce officials, Lions' club members, and other interested parties to a series of conferences on the proposals before submitting the matter of a bond issue to the voters, the consensus of the board at present favors the erection of a new building.

Pointing out that \$15,000 at least will be needed to renovate the outmoded heating plant at the school, Dr. Morrison said he and his fellow members favor the new building plan.

A structure 271 feet long and 63 feet wide, fronting Fourth street, is tentatively proposed. The building, to have two stories and a partial basement, would have a semi-detached gymnasium wing fronting on Reinhart street, 121 by 58 feet.

A separate gymnasium entrance would make it possible for entertainments to be held at nights and outside school hours, Dr. Morrison said, without throwing open the entire school building.

Tentative floor plan drawings call for manual training, home economics and music department rooms on

the main floor, together with laboratories, class rooms, dressing rooms and the principal's office.

The second floor would hold a 28 by 57 study hall, seven class rooms, two commercial course rooms, a teachers' dressing room and library.

Combining Beauty With Talent



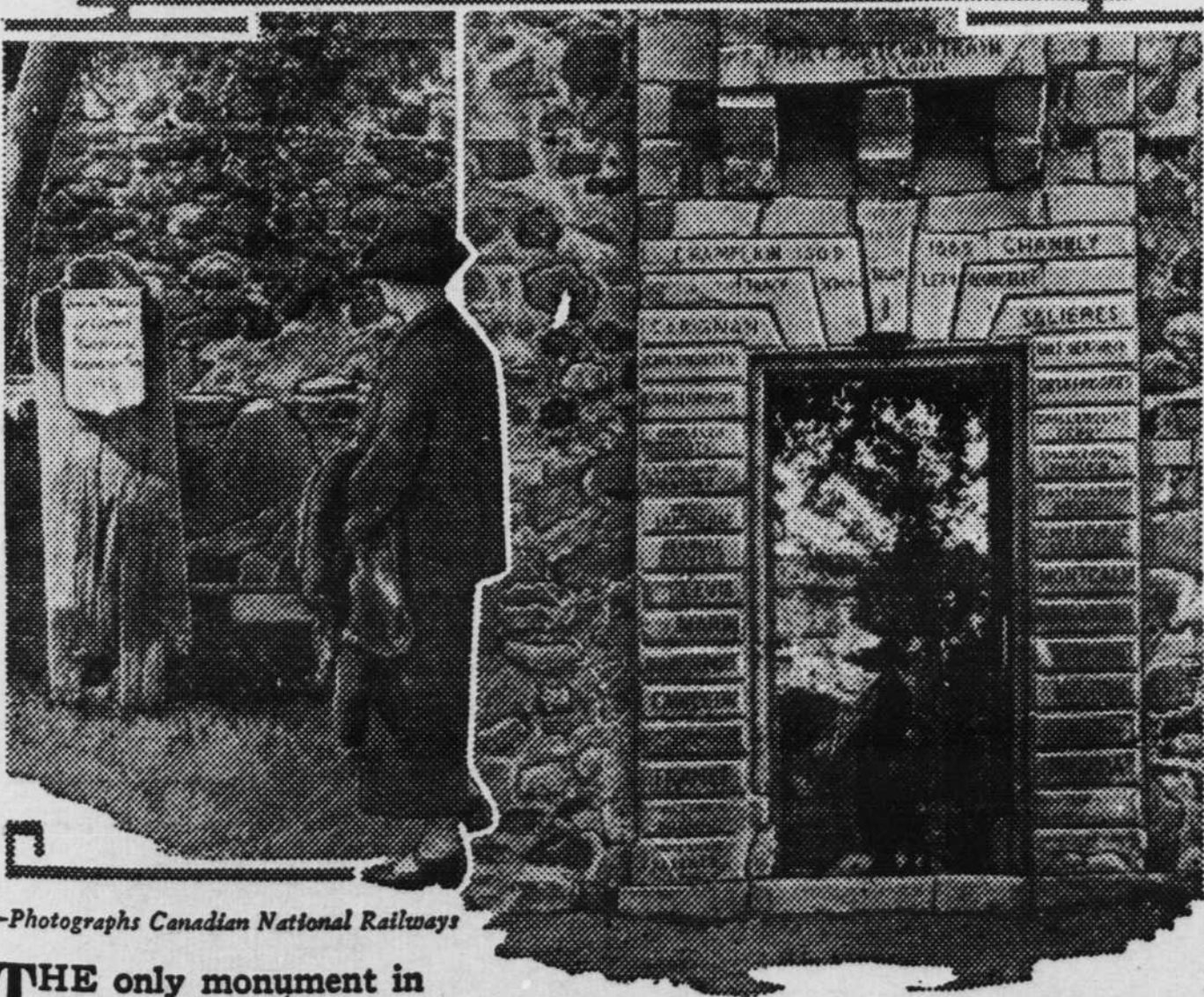
Maxine Marlowe

HIGHROADS OF HISTORY

THE only monument in Canada erected by Daughters of the American Revolution stands in Fort Chambly which is about twenty miles southwest of Montreal on a conspicuous headland of the Richelieu River. The monument, in the form of a bronze tablet, is to the memory of General John Thomas who captured the fort during the War of Independence in 1776 and, with several of his men, died there of smallpox the same year. Fort Chambly, built in 1665, played an important part in the early history of the continent, its final role being taken in the War of 1812. In 1914 it was made one of the historical sites of Canada, and because of its association with American history it is a point of great interest to many hundreds of Americans annually. The photographs show the gateway to the fort and the spot where General Thomas was buried.

Text Of Mine Bill Is Given

Following is the full text of the bill suspending assessment work on located mining claims, as passed by the senate a week ago, and by the house of representatives.

"Be it enacted, etc., That the provision of Section 2324 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, which requires on each mining claim located, and until a patent has been issued therefor, not less than \$100 worth of labor to be performed or improvements aggregating such amount to be made each year, be, and the same is hereby suspended as to all mining claims in the United States during the year beginning at 12 o'clock m., July 1, 1937; Provided, That the provisions of this act shall not apply in the case of any claimant not entitled to exemption from the payment of a Federal income tax for the taxable year 1936. Provided further, That every claimant of any such mining claim, in order to obtain the benefits of this act, shall file, or cause to be filed, in the office where the location notice or certificate is recorded, on or

before 12 o'clock m., July 1, 1937, a notice of his desire to hold said mining claim under this act, which notice shall state that the claimant, or claimants, were entitled to exemption from the payment of a federal income tax for the taxable year 1936; Provided, further, That such suspension of assessment work shall not apply to more than six lode-mining claims held by the same person, nor to more than 12 lode-mining claims held by the same partnership, association or corporation; And provided further, That such suspension of assessment work shall not apply to more than six placer-mining claims not to exceed 120 acres (in all) held by the same person, nor to more than 12 placer-mining claims not to exceed 240 acres (in all) held by the same partnership, association or corporation." The bill became a law when it was signed by the President Thursday, June 24.
