

Training Camp Schedule Fixed

The Citizens' Military Training Camp, which opened at Fort Douglas, Utah, July 1st, with 232 trainees will have a well rounded program arranged for them:

First call will be sounded at 5:45 a. m.
 Drill 7:20 to 11:45 a. m.
 Mess 12:00 noon.
 Drill 1:00 to 1:45 p. m.
 Athletics 2:00 to 4:00 p. m.
 Ceremonies 4:15 to 5:00 p. m.
 Mess 5:15 p. m.

Second Lieut. Wesley O. Shurtliff, In.-Res., well known athletic director from Idaho Falls, will have complete control of all athletic events, including soft ball, volley ball, boxing, tennis, swimming, track and field and various other games. This type of program "makes for healthy bodies and they are tired enough at night to want to sleep," officials explained. Nightly recreation will also be provided for in their routine.

Sergeant Major John Pool will put them through their paces daily and in addition other officers have scheduled hours for the teaching of military science and other phases of instruction.

FRANK B. KELLOGG ENDOWS CARLETON COLLEGE

Mr. Frank B. Kellogg, of St. Paul, Minn., former Secretary of State and co-author of the Kellogg-Briand Peace Pact, recently gave Carleton College, Northfield, Minn., \$500,000 for the establishment of a foundation for the study of international relations.

To be known as the Frank B. Kellogg Foundation for Education in International Relations, the foundation will permit the establishment of a staff of two regular teachers, with a half-time professor from a foreign country.

A feature of the foundation will be several scholarships to foreign students at the college, and approximately the same number to permit Carleton students to study abroad.

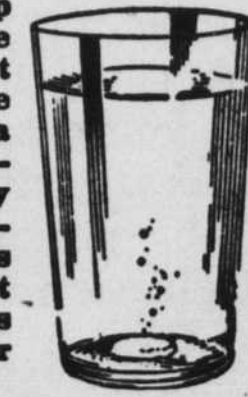
