

The generous offer of the First Presidency to provide material assistance from the general funds of the church to make these improvements in chapel utility and appearance, is expected to be productive of unusual results in this program.



This unusual program started by the church has a four-fold aim.



HIGHROADS OF HISTORY



DORT Lennox, situated on the Richelieu River in Canada about ten miles from the American border is famous in both American and Canadian history Originally known as Ile aux Noix, it was here that the American generals Schuyler and Montgomery issued their famous proclamation inviting Canadians to join the Congressional troops during the War of Independence in 1775. The fort was constructed in 1759 and in the same year, manned by the French, it made the last stand against the British, following the fall of Quebec. With the capture of Ile aux Noix, Montreal became an easy prey to the English troops, and the French domi-

nation of Canada ended. The fort, renamed Fort Lennox. also figured prominently in the war of 1812. It was abandoned in 1870. In 1921 it was reconstructed and is now one of the official historical sites of the dominion and is visited annually by many Americans. The photographs show the gate of the fort and the plaque erected by the Historical Sites Board of Canada.

High Sierras Open To Travel


High Sierra sportsmen will be able 'to go where they want to go; do what they want to do" on both slopes of the mountain range this week-end for winter has finally released its grip on the country.
