## **AUSTRALIA RECEIVES** FIRST CLIPPER MAIL

DARWIN, Australia — Australia's first consignment of the Clpper mail from the United States arrived in Darwin recently on the Qantas liner from Singapore.

According to advices received by the post office here the date of arrival coincies with the arrival of the first regular Australian air mail at San Francisco.

Thsi wek's American mail is not large, but recently both incoming and outgoing planes have been carrying as much as 970 pounds of English mail.

Pilots recall that when the service to England was inaugurated about two years ago experts forecast that with luck Qantas planes might be called upon to carry 309 pounds of English mail at the end of five years.
