# Compensation Forms Mailed

CARSON CITY, Aug. 4. — Regular monthly contribution report forms for pay periods ending in July were mailed to Nevada employers this week by the Unemployment Compensation Division, it was announced today.

The form, designated NUC-2, supercedes the original Form NJC-2-A, which called for batch collection of payments under the law for the first half of the present year. Printed on blue paper the new forms will be mailed to employers each month from now on, that payments may be made according to the law.

Commenting on the monthly report form, George W. Friedhoff, newly appointed division director,

said, "Employers should have little difficulty in filling out the forms which are to be used in figuring their contributions to be paid to the Nevada unemployment compensation fund. A full set of instructions, printed on the reverse side of the form and explaining carefully just what information is required in each item will minimize the chance of error."

The forms were mailed in duplicate, with instructions that employers return the original copy and retain the second for their files. Payments for the month of July must be made on or before August 20, according to division officials.
