# Mining Men To Meet In Sept.

At a recent meeting at Salt Lake City, Utah, a national program committee, under the chai manship of Guy N. Bjorge, general manager of the Homestake Mining Company, whipped into shape pre'iminary plans for the forthcoming annual convention and exposition of the western division of the American Mining Congress. The meeting is to be held at Salt Lake City. September 7 o 10.

Plans call for discussions by members of congress, government officials and outstanding mining leaders on legislation bearing upon the mining industry and on problems of mine operation.

Foremost among topics included on the program for discussion at this meeting are: Gold prices, the future of silver, mineral land withdrawals and the public land policy of the federal government; labor legislation, with particular reference to the status of collective bargaining, the responsibility of labor and federal regulation of hours and wages; mine taxation; the undistributed earnings tax; depletion; tariffs and foreign trade, and the effect of reciprocal trade agreements; money or mining develop-

ment under the operation of the Securities Exchange act; ventilation, FIFE DESTROYS dust elimination and air conditioning in mines and mills; accident prevention and safety methods; occupational diseases legislation; stream pollution and the mining industry; reducing costs of workin mechanical mucking; building roads to prospective mining areas; the economics of small mining plants.

Formation of a declaration of po'icy, representing the views of the entire metal mining industry as to the relationships of mining to the national government, will be undertaken after consideration of hese problems.

In addition to the convention sessions there will be held an exposition of metal mining machinery. equipment and supplies in which over seventy-five nationally known manufacturers will participate. At this date nearly 90 per cent of the available space is under contract. Displays of equipment will include locomotives, loading machines, hoists wire rope, pumps, mine cars, compressors, rock drills, explosives, lubricants, venilating equipment, safety appliances, flotation machinery, filters and everything needed for modern mine and mill eperation.

An interesting feature of this exposition will be a mineral states exposi ion in which the various mining states will participate in showing the progress and importance of metal mining within their individual boundaries.

Featured entertainment is being arranged by the U ah committee for each night of the meeting. Mining inspection trips to Park City, Tintie, Bingham and other mines and metallurgical plants near Salt Lake City will enable convention visitors to see at close hand these famous mining operations.

#### PRINTING THE NEWS

When to print a disagreeab'e story and when to leave one out of the paper is one of the most troublesome problems of a smalltown editor. In the case of a person who is unfaithful to a public trust, or one who is guilty of serious crime, it is not difficut to decide, because the public interest, as well as the public's right to have the news, demands that it be printed.

There are some cases, however, in which the offense is entirely of a personal nature, and in which

publishing the story would bring sorrow and embarrassment to innocent persons without serving any beneficial purpose. In these the making of a proper decision is often not easy. If the story is printed, relatives and friends of the person concerned will feel that it is unnecessary; if it is suppressed, the scandal-mongers will be disappointed, and many will insinuate that the editor was "bought off."

These same scandal - mongers would howl the loudest, however, if their own shady actions were held up to public gaze.

So it's hard to please everybody, and no editor of sense tries to please everybody. He must let his own judgment and his own conscience be his guide.


If he errs on the side of kindness and sympathy for the unfortunate, his error will be forgiven by the more enlightened readers of his newspaper.
