First Flight Stamps Ready

For the benefit of philatelists, TWA will carry first flight covers imprinted with a special cachet stamp aboard inaugural trips on its new San Francisco to Winslow air route, line officials said today.

Start of service will be on September 5th, and letters intended for the cachet should be addressed to Postmasters at San Francisco, Fresno, Las Vegas or Winslow before that date.

Envelopes should bear airmail postage, should be addressed to destination and sent under cover to Postmaster at one of the four towns mentioned. Postmasters G. T. Stevens of Winslow and Frank F. Gar-side of Las Vegas have advised TWA officials that already they are receiving envelopes to be held for dispatch on the first flights.

Inscription on the cachet stamp reads "First Flight, Winslow, Arizona; Las Vegas, Nevada; Fresno, California; San Francisco, California, U. S. Air Mail." As the route passes over an extremely scenic region, embracing Yosemite and Sequoia National Parks, Death Valley, Mt. Whitney, Boulder Dam, Meade Lake and Grand Canyon, a plane flying over a mountainous area forms the greater portion of the cachet stamp.

Six hundred concessions—the most thrilling from applications that run into the thousands—will enliven the 40-acre Midway at the World's Fair on San Francisco Bay.

Capitol Office Changes Made

Important changes are being made in the occupancy of space in the crowded, 60-year old capitol left vacant when the state library, supreme court and attorney general's office were moved to the new building, according to the Carson City Appeal.

Rooms formerly occupied by the attorney general and his staff on the first floor will be taken over by the secretary of state, who plans to move his motor vehicle department from across the hall to bring his entire department in the same suite of offices.

The state controller will expand to take one of the rooms left vacant by the motor vehicle division. Tentative plans of the board of capitol commissioners call for conversion of the other into first floor rest room for women.

Into the octagonal building behind the capitol formerly housing the state library will move the public service commission from the state printing building and the rapidly expanding unemployment division now temporarily carrying on its work in the senate chamber.

The old supreme court room probably will be used for public hearings of the public service commission and other departments.

The printing office will expend its quarters upstairs to take over the public service commission rooms.

It is hoped that the state board of health office will be moved from its

present downtown location to one or more of the rooms on the second floor of the capitol. State education offices will occupy the other rooms left vacant upstairs.
