The guests were housed in tent cottages scattered about the main tent which contained the dining room and kitchen. We found beds and other conveniences of the camp very satisfactory, especially considering the comparative inaccessibility of the spot in the heart of the wildest region of the west.

After an ample breakfast we embarked next morning shortly after seven o'clock and were given a boat ride which took us for about twenty miles into the lower reaches of Grand Canyon. The sublime and beautiful scenery, unlike anything else in America, was given wrapt attention by the visitors.

The Merce Ferry camp is conducted by Jim Purvis, superintendent, and he is aided by Chef Jim Owen; "ad" Emery, father of Murl Emery, who is in charge of the dock, and Fred Hilte, who is boat pilot and, when necessary, assistant to the chef. The entire crew seems to take pride in catering to the comfort of all visitors.

The return trip to the Boulder City landing was made without mishap, the boat landing about 1:30 after a fine luncheon served by the host.

The afternoon was devoted to a tour of the dam, an inspection and study of the metallurgical plant and a visit to the Boulder Dam film showing at which Earl Brothers did the honors.

The entire party returned to Las Vegas in time for a short rest before being guests at the dinner tendered the distinguished visitors in the Marine room of Hotel Apache by Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce.

President O. A. Kimball presided as master of ceremonies, introducing the guests. Very short addresses were made by Congressman Fitzpatrick, Congressman O'Neal and Congressman Scrugham.

Addresses of welcome were made by Lieut.-Gov. Alward for the state of Nevada and Mayor Arnett for the city of Las Vegas.

The speaking was curtailed because of the necessity of closing the meeting at nine o'clock to permit the visitors to take the train for Los Angeles.

# Game Protection Plan Advanced

Mr. W. M. Rush, regional director of the United States Biological Society, Region One, with offices in Portland, states that the plan, recently approved by Secretary Wallace, to obtain greater participation of state game officials in matters affecting migratory bird protection is going to be of great benefit to the states, as well as the Biological Survey, in legislative matters.

According to the plan, advanced by Ira N. Gabrielson, chief of the United States biological survey, and already endorsed by a majority of the state commissions, representatives of the states will meet annually with federal wild-life officials to discuss conditions affecting migratory game birds and their pursuit by hunters.

The state leaders probably will meet with members of the biological survey early in summer, following a similar conference with the bureau of fisheries. Throughout the year and preceding conferences, the biological survey plans to forward to the state officials data collected by bureau naturalists and information on problems as they arise. Regional meetings at various times will also permit further consultation between the state and federal wild-life workers.
