Home Ownership Enhances Value

Pointing out that "the savings and loan business represents a community industry" and stressing the fact that such associations have an all-important role in home financing, Dr. H. E. Hoagland, member of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, stated today that "the quality of a community may be guaged by its interest in thrift and home ownership."

Dr. Hoagland said that "in addition to the investors, the borrowers and the managers of savings and loan associations, the whole community has a vital interest in the existence of well-managed thrift and home-financing institutions."

Speaking from his experience as a member of the board which supervises agencies serving the savings and loan business, Dr. Hoagland said that "a home owner is distinctively different from a tenant.

"Even the owner of rental property is likely to give it less attention than he would if he were occupying it as his home. The quality of his interest is decidedly different as a real estate owner than it would be as a home owner. As a real estate owner, he is primarily interested in the monetary return which the property produces for him. Consequently he attempts to maximize his receipts and minimize his expenditures.

"The home owner, on the other hand, ordinarily looks upon the property which he occupies not from the standpoint of monetary return but from the point of view of the satisaction its use gives him As a result, the feeling of pride in his home is enhanced by expenditures on the property rather than by skimping on such outlays.

"These observations produce the rather paradoxical conclusion that real estate occupied by the owner represents a more stable investment than it would be if held primarily for investment. In any event, it is obvious that the community as a whole is interested not only in encouraging thrift among its citizens but in promoting home ownership, as well."

Dr. Hoagland referred to the fact that "services rendered by the federal agencies are available to all units of the industry which can meet the reasonable qualifications set up by the Federal Home Lean Bank Board.
