

Church Campaign Is Very Successful

LAS VEGAS, Nev.—Following the successful completion of the three district dinner conferences held recently in Elko, Las Vegas and Reno to further Bishop Thomas K. Gorman's religious and social service program, Las Vegas was the scene

Thursday, September 30, of one of a series of mass meetings going on throughout the state. Principal speaker at each of the gatherings was the Bishop himself.

According to E. W. Cragin, parish chairman, highlight of the local mass meeting was the Bishop's address in which he pointed out the dignity of the diocesan appeal. Laying special stress on the church's obligation to foster the poor, he called for the cooperation of all present in furthering the formation of a Catholic social service bureau.

The Rev. John F. White, brilliant New York orator, spoke on the campaign to be launched to enroll every Catholic man and woman in the state in "The Bishop's Confraternity of the Laity." He then set forth to the audience the mechanics of the campaign. His address was followed by a series of questions and answers dealing with the movement presented by the delegates present.

Mr. Cragin also reported that subscriptions given at the district dinners totaled \$29,000. These funds will be used to inaugurate the improvement program.

It was announced at the meeting that another feature of campaign is a series of radio broadcasts over Reno Station KOH. The program, beginning Monday, September 27, included as speakers, the Hon. E. P. Carville, United States District Attorney; J. F. Shaughnessy, W. S. Boyle, George McKernon, James

Santini, and Thomas Grimm. Bishop Gorman will conclude the series with his broadcast Sunday afternoon, October 3, at 2:00 p. m.

Campaign officials, according to the local pastor, the Rev. Michael O'Meara declare that previous subscriptions indicate that the \$50,000 goal will be easily reached.

TESTED RECIPE

Fruit Pudding

Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Add salt. Chill. When slightly thickened, fold in fruits and nuts. Turn into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold. Serve plain, or with whipped cream. Serves 8.

DUKE FOUNDATION AIDS SHRINE HOSPITAL IN S. C.

Among the contributions made to that great charity of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobels of the Mystic Shrine, the Hospitals for Crippled Children, was that of the late James Buchanan Duke, through the foundation established by the terms of his will.

This foundation contributes one dollar per day for each free bed patient in the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children at Greenville, S. C. Since all beds in the hospital are free, this contribution now averages \$22,000 per year, or slightly more than one-third of the entire annual operating expense of that institution.

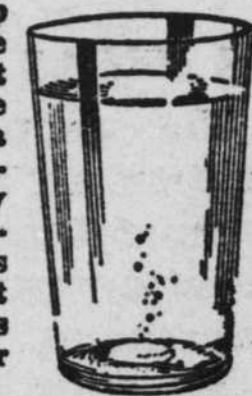
