

## Bishop Gorman Ends Campaign

RENO, Nev. — A house to house canvass of Catholic people of the state, the last step in the religious development campaign being directed by Bishop Thomas K. Gorman, resulted, it is believed, in bringing the total subscriptions to well over the \$50,000 goal set.

Previous steps in the campaign were a state-wide Catholic census, three district dinners at Reno, Elko and Las Vegas, and six district mass meetings held in Winnemucca, Elko, Ely, Las Vegas, Tonopah and Reno.

The method of canvassing employed, says Judge Carville, has included the formation of teams in every parish of the diocese, each captained by a Catholic lay leader. Under the captain's direction, these teams have made house-to-house calls upon Catholics, and have solicited memberships in the diocesan society known as "The Bishop's Confraternity of Laity." Revenue produced by voluntary dues in the organization will finance Bishop Gorman's development program. The money will be expended in the erection and repair of churches and rectories, in the education of additional clergy, in the subsidizing of priests in outlying districts, in the establishment of religious instruction centers, and in the erection of a Catholic charity agency.

The campaign was officially concluded Thursday evening, October 7, although outlying districts have not yet submitted their report.

## Safety Division Motion Pictures

CARSON CITY, Nev., Oct. 5.—Beginning an intensive campaign of motion picture display service, the Safety Division of the Nevada Department of Highways has arranged for the showing of motion pictures dealing with safe driving before numerous schools and service clubs throughout the state, according to information given out at headquarters today.

Two very interesting productions titled "Horse Sense in Horse Power" and "Everybody's Buisness" will be used to carry on the work. These pictures were shown before the student body of Carson City high school last week and were given an enthusiastic response. Later, B. C. Hartung, in charge of the work, addressed the assembly explaining the safety program as conducted in the state and pointing out the responsibility of the younger people in this movement.

On Tuesday of this week the productions were shown to the combined student bodies of the Yerington high and grammar schools. In the evening the same productions were shown to a meeting of the Rotary club in that city.

### A Dusting Hint

To prevent dust from settling on nearby furniture while beating upholstered furniture or mattresses, dampen an old bath towel, wring it dry and spread it over the part of the surface you wish to beat. Then beat right over the towel; the dust will be removed yet will not settle on other furniture.

Surface unit meal: Skillet of beef patties and vegetables, angel pudding with custard sauce.

Broiler meal: Broiled meat cakes wrapped in bacon, broiled tomato halves topped with buttered crumbs, broiled cooked carrots, broiled caramelized grapefruit.

### Lump-less Mashed Potatoes

To mash potatoes without lumps, put them through a potato ricer into some hot milk with a lump of butter in it. Then beat them briskly for a minute and your mashed potatoes will be lumpless.

## Methodists Plan Temperance Work

On Sunday, October 31st, Methodist churches all over the United States will observe what is known as World Temperance Sunday. One Methodist denomination, namely, The Methodist Episcopal church, includes more than twenty-four thousand local Methodist churches, most of which are located north of the Mason-Dixon line, in the central states and in the west. The Methodist Episcopal church, South, however, which has close to four-thousand Methodist churches

throughout the South and the West, will also observe this day in very much the same manner as it will be observed in the Methodist Episcopal church. Present indications are that these two great Methodist denominations, together with the Methodist Protestant church, will be united into one body within the next three years. This will mean a church under the name of The Methodist Church, with a membership of practically eight million.
