# Small Schools Disappearing

One-room school houses disappear at the rate of seven or eight a day, and soon the "litle red school house" will be only a memory. Leading officials and educators are pushing the campaign to abolish the oneroom, one-teacher school.

The PWA program is largely the reason for the change, in school buildings, as that activity has been building larger buildings to which school buses carry children from miles around.

One in every four persons in the entire country has been enrolled in class rooms this fall, according to . the United States Office of Education. Even so, there has been a drop of over 1,000,000 pupils in the elementary schools since 1936.

A total of 1,020,000 public and private school teachers are engaged in teaching the "young idea" - and perhaps a good deal of the "old idea," the science of "how to shoot." The average pay of city school teachers is \$1,735 a year, and \$787 a year for rural teachers.
