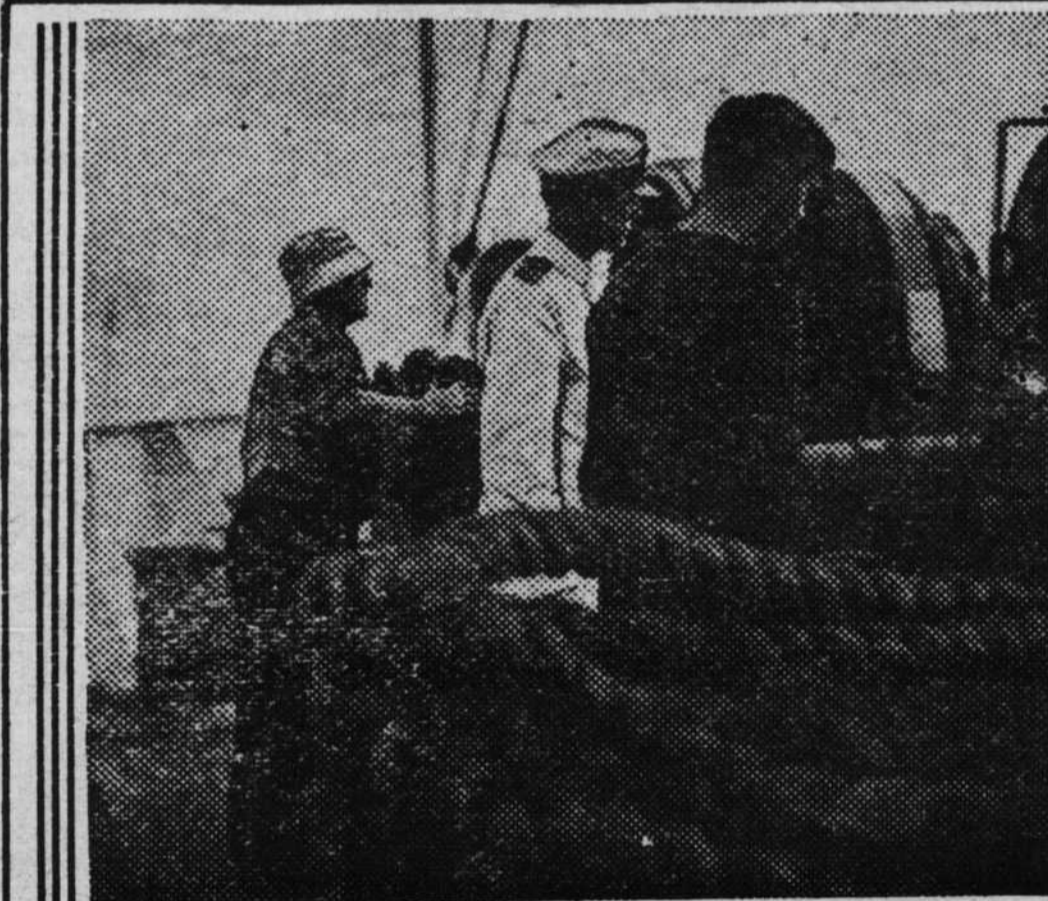


NEVADA RANCHERS LOOK THEM OVER

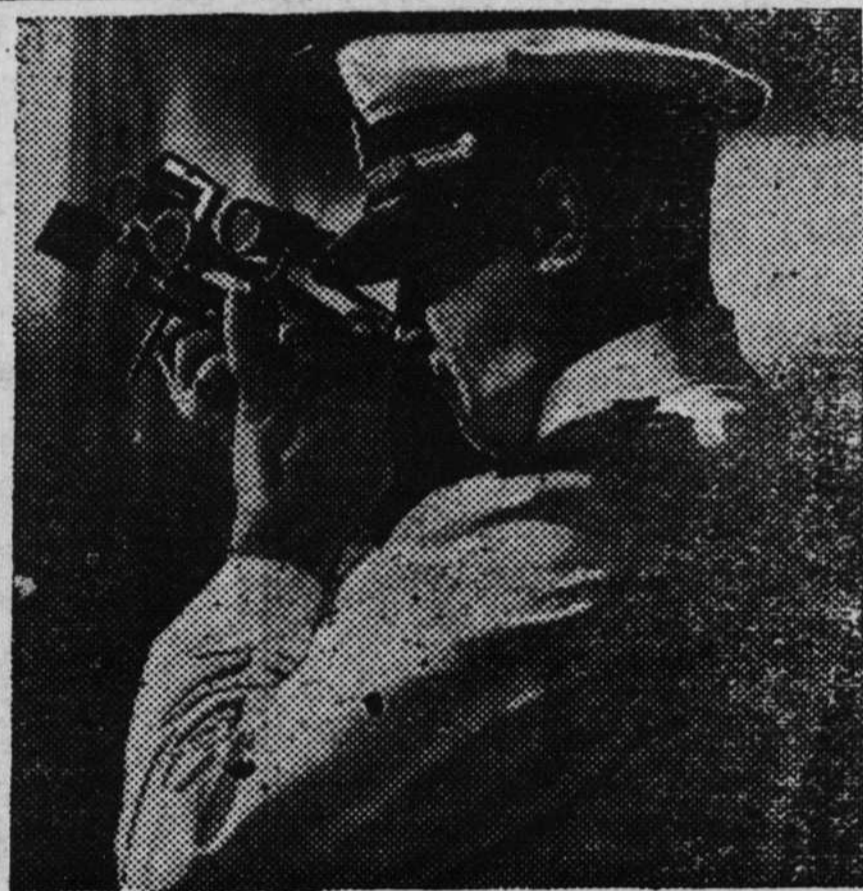


First of a series of cattle grading demonstrations was recently held in Washoe county and this picture shows the stockmen "boning up" on the good points of the animals.

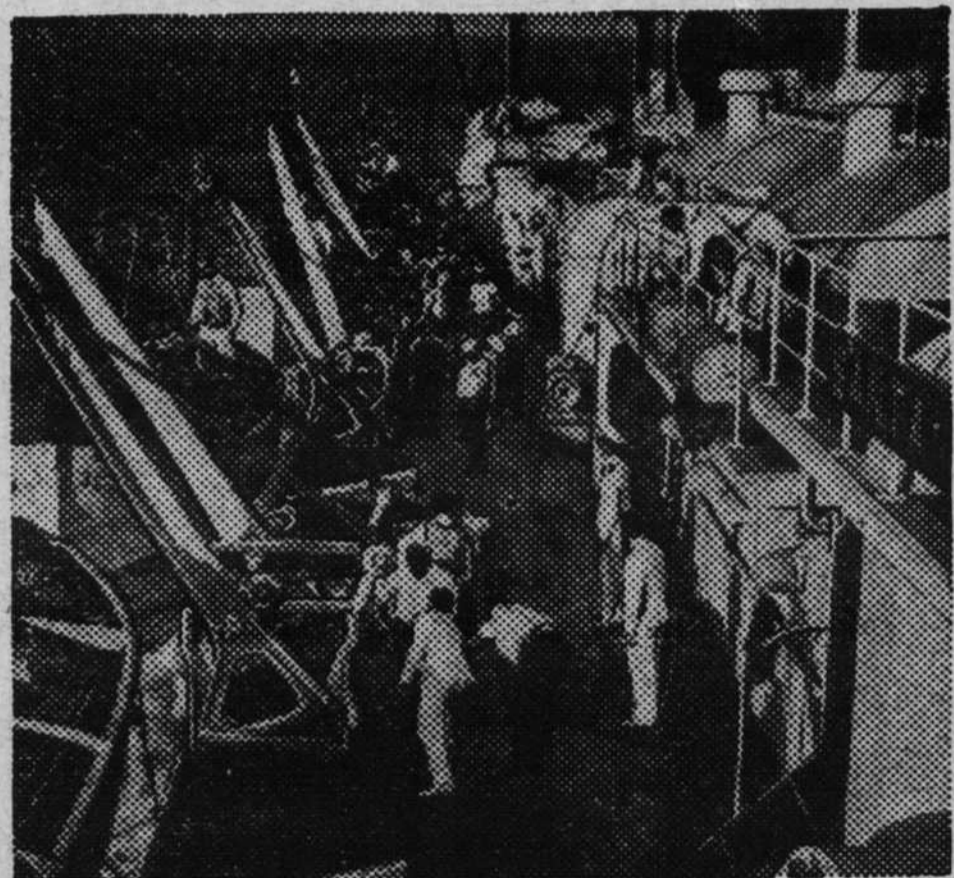
IN COMMAND OF THE SHIP



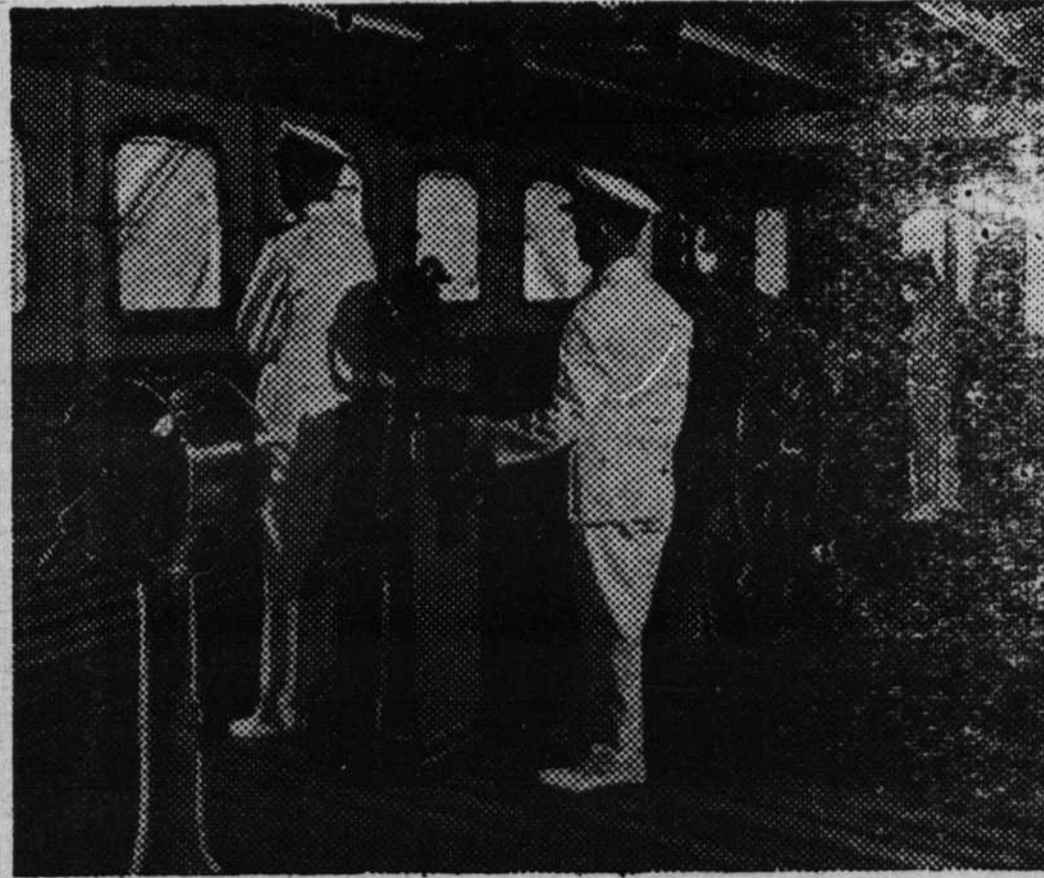
A ship's officer's duties are endless. As the "Santa Lucia" docks at Cristobal an officer supervises the seamen handling the forward lines.

Union Pacific Testing Diesel

The new Union Pacific locomotive City of Los Angeles, the largest Diesel unit ever constructed, functioned perfectly, officials said today, on a seven-hour test run between Omaha and Chicago.

The new engine, completed last week, will be placed on the train City of Los Angeles, between Chicago and Los Angeles. A sister unit, the City of San Francisco, will be completed within two weeks, officials said.

The new unit is a 5400-horsepower locomotive, as compared with the 2400 horsepower of the City of Denver, and is designed to carry seventeen cars 100 miles an hour.
