## Passes Closed Through Sierras

Eight to twelve inches of snow have fallen on the Tioga, Sonora, Ebbetts and Kit Carson passes over the Sierra, closing them to through travel, Nevada division offices of the California State automobile association reported. As no attempt will be made to reopen them, these routes may now be considered closed for the winter, officials said.

Although open and passable, tire chains are advisable on the Placerville route between Reno and Sacramento, due to the recent snow storms over Echo Summit. The snow belt etended over the Clear Creek grade, Lake Tahoe and Echo Summit areas of sufficient depth to require the use of maintenance crews to clear. Due to etreme slippery conditions at Echo Summit, chains are necessary through this area, the report said. Careful driving is recommended in the Tahoe region on account of ice and snow in shady spots, and chain sshould be carried.

Storms in the high altitude resulted in light snowfall on the Mono Lake-Bishop route, Reno to Los Angeles, but with no interruption to travel. Onl a very light covering of snow fell at Bridgeport, Conwa grade and Mono Lake, increasing to a depth of four inches at Deadman's pass. Although chains are not compulsory, they should be carried for emergency. The balance of the route is entirely clear.

The new Feather River highway from Reno to Oroville was reported in good condition, despite unsettled conditions in the mountains. Mod-

erate rains only fell in the Feather River territory.

Eight inches of snow fell in Lassen National park, closing the Loop highway. No attempt will be made to reopen it.

Motorists traveling the Lassen Volcanic highway, between Reno and Red Bluff, will encounter snow conditions west of Susanville. More than eight inches of snow fell over the Fredonia Summit area, making the use of chains advisable, and careful driving a necessity. The balance of the route is in good condition, according to the report.
