PREDATORY ANIMALS BEING EXTERMINATED

With the first report of the trappers, who are going after the predatory animals of Charleston mountain, just in, it appears that coyotes, cats and foxes in this area will receive ne quarter until they are thoroughly cleaned out. This man reports that since the drive began, two weeks ago that he has caught 37 coyotes, 33 foxes (swift and gray) and nine bobcats. Two of the latter are the largest this experienced trapper has seen to date. Reports from the other men have not been received.

The present campaign is being staged in an effort to eliminate as many predatory animals from the mountain as possible before planting the turkeys and sage grouse which are ordered for the area. Also these coyotes are making serious inroads into the deer and mountain sheep of the area, by killing off the younger deer and sheep. It was noted recently that a large buck had been brought down by coyotes after an injury had weakened him considerably.

The trappers were made available through relief appropriations to the forest service and cooperation with the local WPA agency.
