Hufford Made Foley's Deputy

Joe Hufford has been appointed by District Attorney Foley as his deputy to serve for such time as Assistant District Attorney Henderson requires for a study of the suits brought by southern California interests which are seeking to avoid payment of taxes upon their Boulder dam power transmission lines in this county.

Hufford will attend to the routine business of the office while Henderson devotes his time exclusively to the tax problems.

The city of Los Angeles protests payment of taxes upon its lines, claiming that it is part of a federal agency in respect to Boulder Dam power and so not subject to taxation. The Metropolitan Water District is paying under protest. Both declare their intention of fighting the issue through the courts.

Hufford has been engaged in the practice of law for eleven years, the last four years being in Las Vegas.

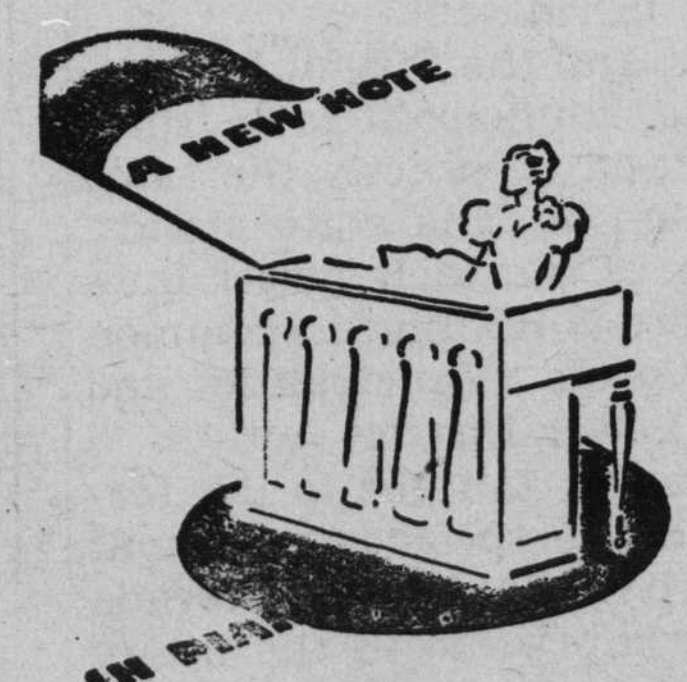

DUMPLINGS are like the little girl with the curl. When they're good they're very, very good—and when they're not, they are just culinary bad news. The trick with dumplings is the leavening of them to positively ethereal lightness with double-acting baking powder.



Such dumplings make a lamb stew welcome even in family circles where the word "stew" is a red rag to a bull.

Dumplings for Stew 1 cup sifted flour; 1 1/2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon melted butter; 1/2 cup milk. Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Add butter to milk; add to flour and stir carefully until all flour is dampened and soft dough is formed. Drop from teaspoon on boiling stew; cover very tightly and cook, without removing cover, 5 to 7 minutes, according to size of dumplings. Serves 6 to 8.
