DEATH IN THE DESERT

A recent issue of Life contained a pictorial review of the fight againts tuberculosis. Probably the most startling revelation, to many people, is the fact that climate has little or no bearing on modern treatment of tuberculosis. Virtually every state and county in the Union are equipped to competently care for tuberculosis patients. Yet, tragically, thousands of people continue to flock to the locality which public dogma has erroneously taught them to believe is of greatest benfit. Each year hundreds upon hundreds of people forsake Just two hours after a little girl had been hit by a truck home and family, or worse, bring their families with them, and spend their last cent reaching the deserts of the southwest. Upon arrival they are ineligible for local aid and can do nothing but wait in poverty-for death. At home they could in most cases have secured prompt and effective aid from the county or state, either of which is prepared for just such cases. Don't let such a horrible mistake wreck your family.

DISCOURAGING ACCIDENT ROCKETEERS

in Brooklyn, two men were arrested in a trap laid for them at her father's home, on the charge of soliciting accident cases, a misdemeanor under the New York penal code.

This is another victory for the Brooklyn Rackets Bureau's investigation of ambulance chasing, and has brought the number of arrests to 17. The Claims Bureau of the Association of Casualty and Surety Executives is cooperating with the Brooklyn authorities in the investigation.

Ambulance chasing, claim frauds and faked claims constitute a group of common crimes which affect every citizen and strike at the pocketbooks of every insurance policy holder. In the New York area, signal success has been achieved in apprehending and punishing these wolves who often prey on the poor and ignorant. Large organizations, staffed with crooked doctors and lawyers, have been uncovered and the principals sent to prison for long terms. These organizations have cheated insurance companies out of millions a year-a graft which is financially reflected in the cost of all casualty insurance, inasmuch as the amount of claims the industry must pay is what determines the annual cost of the policies it issues.

All other cities, towns and states would do well to emulate New York's example and carry on a determined war on the accident racketeers. Experienced detectives and first class prosecutors are necessary. And the cost of this work is microscopic in comparison to the savings to the public which follow-to say nothing of the public service rendered in stamping out all kinds of crime. The ambulance chaser and the claim fraud crook deserve no mercy.
