Would Open New Road to Lake

William Lawe, William Mackie and William Ridenour, members of the board of supervisors and John J. Cunningham, clerk of the board, joined with Guy D. Edwards, supervisor of the Lake Mead recreational area, Sam Hendricks, engineer of the National Parks Service and Jim Purvis, official of the Grand Canyon Tours, Inc., and made a trip to the region of Lake Mead near the old Bonelli ferry at the upper end of Sacramento valley. The purpose of the trip was to confer on the possibility of getting a suitable road into the lake beaches for the accommodation and pleasure of those

who desire to explore this particular section of the lake area.

This particular location at the northern end of Sacramento valley has one of the best beaches along the extensive shore line of 500 miles. Local fishermen claim this section of the lake to be possessed of the best fishing grounds. It is here the lake has its widest point between the Sacramento valley on the south and the mouth of the Virgin river on the north, a distance varying from twenty to forty miles.

To facilitate means of getting into this area, the party yesterday made a visual survey of the possibility of getting a passable highway into the area. It is thought that by leaving highway 93 at a point near Housholders pass, about nineteen miles southerly from Boulder dam and about sixty miles
