Nevada Leads In Repayments

One hundred and three of a total of 1206 Home Owners Loan Corporation loans have been repaid in Nevada, according to announcement made Saturday by J. H. Bradshaw, Nevada ofice manager. The amount repaid totals \$606,421 on a total of \$3,300,000.

The Nevada liquidation percentage increased 9.1 per cent during the past 12 months, making the record for the state the best in the country, Bradshaw said. Nevada also ranks first in the percentage of accounts liquidated with a figure of 8.5 per cent.
