

Broili Dies in San Francisco

Frank O. Broili 63, well known hydro-electric engineer, long a resident of Reno, died in San Francisco last Friday, February 18, as the result of a heart ailment from which he has suffered for several months.

The deceased was a resident of Nevada for more than thirty-five years and was known and respected by the people of Nevada.

He was engineer in charge of several of the original Truckee river power plants and for a time was employed by the Nevada-California Power Company in Tonopah.

He was in charge of construction of the water and electric systems of Wells, Elko, Winnemucca and was connected with the construction of the Boulder Dam-Pioche power line.

Mr. Broili had served as assistant state engineer and, under Governors Emmet D. Boyle and James G. Scrugham, was engineer for the public service commission.

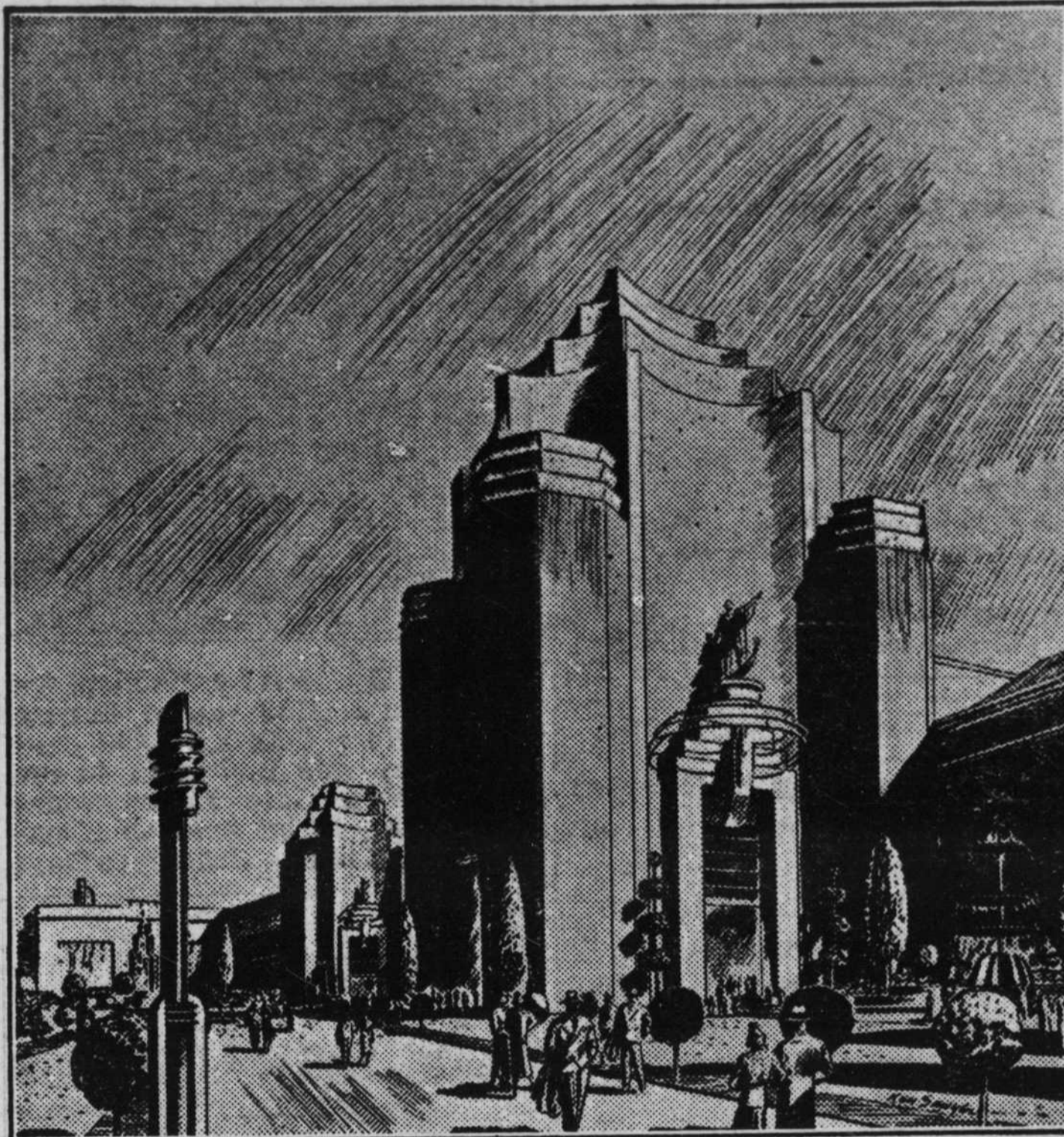
NEW HOME FOR

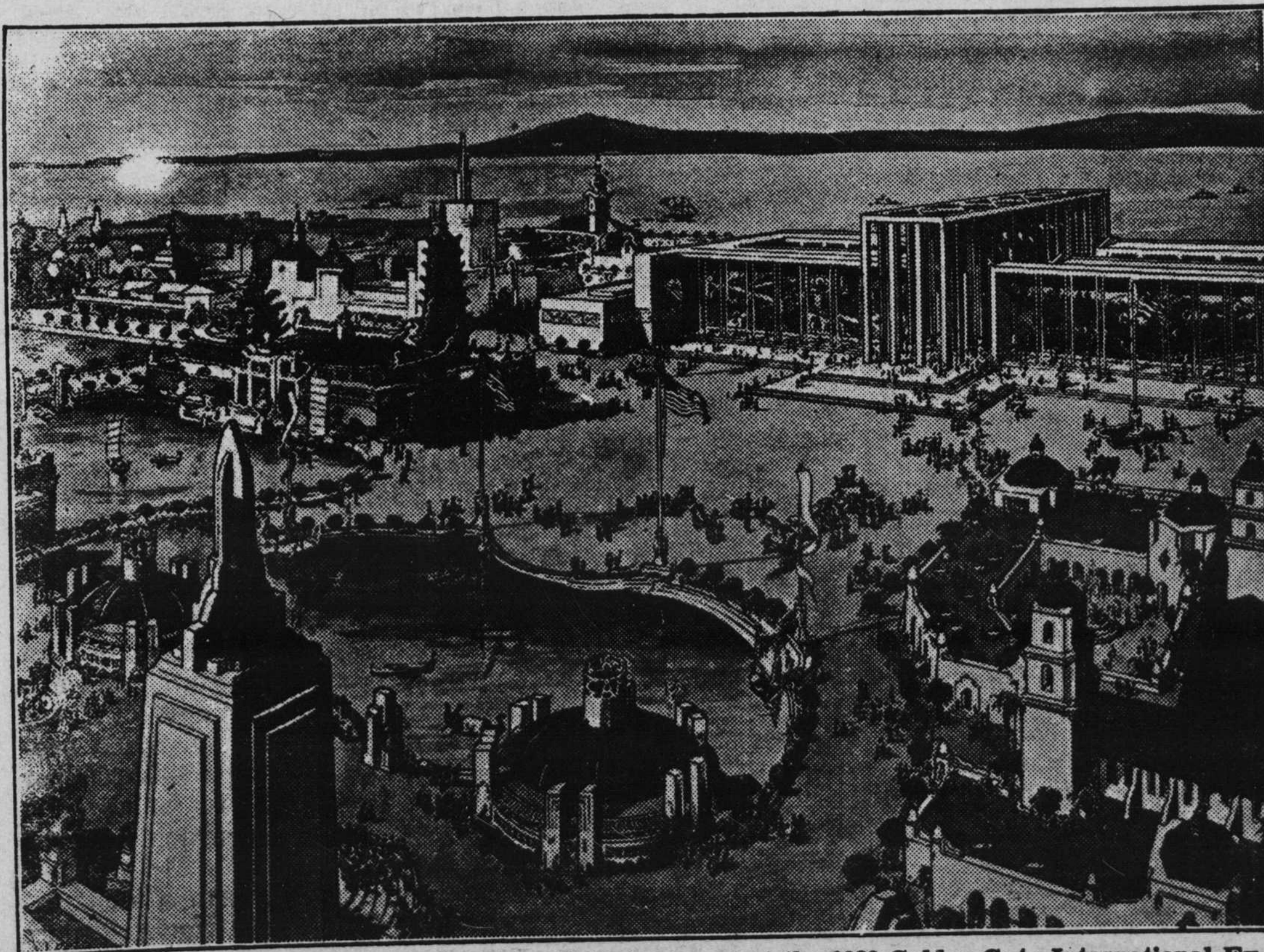
