Prayer of dedication and for continued Masonic Service of Past Grand Master, Hugh Moore, who was originator of Reobligation Ceremony in Kentucky. Song-"Blest Be the Tie That Binds" in honor of Past Grand Master I. B. Ross. Closing of Lodge.


