

Preparations for Religious Life

For half a century the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, founded by D. L. Moody in 1886, has provided instructon and traning without cost of tuition to earnest minded young men and women who desire either to be better informed workers in home churches or to devote their lives to full-time Christian service in some specialized field. Ministers, evangelists, missionaries on home and foreign fields. Christian education directors, gospel song directors for churches and Sunday Schools, and many other types of workers have received their training at this school. The Rt. Rev. Thomas Jenkins of Reno, Bishop of the Episcopal Dicocese of Nevada, met Tuesday evening with his local committee and made further plans for entertaining the Synod of the Pacific Province of the United States in this city, May 9, 10, 11 and 12.

Those taking part in the meeting with Bishop Jenkins were Fr. J. H. Terry, Mrs. Guy Edwards and Mr. and Mrs. Knickerbocker of Bouder City; Mrs, Elizabeth Downing, Mrs. Murray Dickinson, Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Crozier, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Hansen and Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Squires, and K. O. Knudson, of Las Vegas.

Additions to the personnel of some of the working committees were made and partial reports were received.

Bishop Jenkins stated that the coming Synod will be probably the greatest religious convention ever held within the state.

The Pacific Province includes the states of California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and Nevada; the Hawaiian Islands and the Philippines and the Territory of Alaska.

Coconut Transparent Pie

% cup butter; 1 teaspoon grated orange or lemon rind; 1 cup sugar; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 5 egg yolks; 1/2 baked 9-inch pie shell; 2 cups shredded coconut.

3 egg whites; 6 tablespoons sugar. Cream butter with rind; add sugar gradually, creaming until light and fluffy. Add salt and egg yolks, and beat very thoroughly (about 10 minutes). Turn into pie shell, sprinkle with 1 cup coconut, and bake in slow oven (300° F.) 1 hour. Beat egg whites until foamy throughout. Add sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating after each addition until sugar is blended Then continue beating until min ture will stand in peaks. Pile light ly on filling. Sprinkle with remain ing 1 cup coconut. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 15 minutes, of until delicately browned.
