## JUMBO MINE WORK STARTS WITH REOPENING OF ROADS MILL RESUMPTION PLANNED

A crew of miners was reported this week to have resumed development work in tunnels on the Jumbo gold property at Awakening, Humboldt County, after a shut-down enforced by heavy storms and impassable roads.

Under the direction of G. W. Schilling, mine superintendent for the Hunt-Wadley group of wealthy Texas oil operators who acquired the property nearly a year ago under a \$10,000,000 option purchase, work for the present will be confined to development through present mine opening, since the road to the mill is still blocked by snow or muddy.

Road conditions in and near the slumbering hills, in which the Awakening district is situated, still render difficult the transportation of supplies and equipment to the Jumbo mine and adjacent mining properties, it was reported.

Starting with a small crew, Supt. Schilling was quoted as saying that within another fortnight he would have a force of around 25 men at work on development and that upon resumption of milling Joe Lyon, who last year had a contract to truck the ore six miles to the mill, will again undertake delivery of ore to

the plant.

George B. Austin, formerly of Jungo and now a resident of Reno, purchased the Jumbo gold property from two prospectors who discovered it, for \$10,000, with down payment of \$500.

Upon entering into an option agreement with J. K. Wadley and H. L. Hunt involving total payments aggregating \$10,000,000 with payments extending over a term of 30 years, Austin and members of his family, co-owners of the property, received down payments in certified checks for \$250,000.

Under the option terms, royalties on gold production are to apply on the purchase price, with minimum property payments of \$100,000 yearly. It was understood that the 1938 payment of \$100,000 will fall due next month.

Litigation involving the Jumbo property is still pending, several suits having been instituted involving grubstakes and other claims.—Nevada Mining Journal.

## Mt. City Costs High in 7 Months

Indicative of the magnitude of the Mountain City Copper project and of the heavy cash outlay involved in its operation are figures released officially this year. The statement shows the company's expenditures for seven months of 1937—Jan. 1 to Aug. 1—to have been as follows:

Trucking, \$240,000; railroad freight \$160,000; freight on bullion, \$117,663, mine and mill payroll, \$360,000, contractors' payrolls, \$100,000; supplies, \$305,000, making a total of \$1,282,663. The company reported net profit of \$1,059,299 for last year.—Nevada Mining Journal.
