
### Prominent Couple Married Here

### 9000 Floodlights Illuminate Fair

SCHENECTADY, N. Y., April 28 -Contract for 9,000 floodlights largest order of its kind ever placed has been received from the 1939 Golden Gate International Exposition, company officers announced. Total cost of equipment for exterior illumination on Treasure Island will exceed \$500,000. The order was signed by W. P. Day, Exposition Director of Works.

A. F. Dickerson, manager of the firm's illuminating laboratories here and in New York, has just returned from San Francisco after several weeks work with the Exposition divisions of electricity, color and architecture, perfecting illumination plans for the World's Fair of the West.

He said the record floodlight order insured carying out of elaborate plans to make the Exposition "a magic city appearing at night to float on San Francisco Bay."

# Here for Rodeo Will Broadcast

Norman H. Davis known throughout the world's diplomatic circles for his work in behalf of the United States, will address the nation for the first time-as chairman of the American Red Cross when the National Red Cross convention convenes in San Francisco Monday morning, May 2. His remarks to the convention, assembled in the Civic auditorium, will be broadcast over the National Broadcasting Company's blue network, also over the Columbia and Mutual networks, 10:30 to 11 a.m. (Pacific Standard

A world-wide goodwill program to reach 18 million Junior Red Cross members in 53 countries, will be broadcast from the Junior Red Cross Convention, San Francisco (2 to 2:30 p.m. (Pacific Standard Time) Wednesday, May 4. The National Broadcasting Company will release the program over the Blue network throughout the West and over the Red network in the East. General Electric Company's shortwave stations W2XAF and W2XAD will carry the broadcast to all foreign

The United States Office of Education, Department of the Interior, is cooperating with the Red Cross in the broadcast. Parts of the program will be released from New York. Stress was laid on the fact that the 18 million Junior Red Cross members are organized to carry love and good fellowship to all men with the motto, "I Serve."

#### AT LAST-THE TVA

INVESTIGATION The joint House-Senate investiga-

tion of the Tennessee Valley Authority, will be a real job.

Growing public interest in the tangled affairs of the Authority made this investigation inescapable. Charges and countercharges, plots and counterplots, seemingly unbridgeable differences between the directors, accusations of waste and irregularity-such things as these have characterized the TVA's stormy history. Matters finally reached the point where an investigation was essential not only to protect the vast public interest in the TVA, but in justice to its directors and sponsors If the TVA has been managed honestly and efficiently, that should be proven beyond question -if the opposite is the case, quick and drastic remedial action should be taken by Congress.

Above all, this should be a nonpolitical, non-partisan investigation. It should be neither a whitewash nor a muckraking expedition. It should favor neither the proponents nor the opponents of the TVA. It should be thorough, sweeping and dispassionate.

Is it true or is it not true that the TVA has pursued ruthless and rapacious tactics in dealing with private business in the Southeast? Is it true or is it not true that millions in tax money have been spent for useless purposes? Is it true or is it not true that TVA management has at times been swayed by purely political considerations? Is it true or not true that personal enmities and jealousies among TVA directors have made efficient, business-like operation impossible? It is such questions as these that the public wants answered-completely, fairly and finally.
