
A Good Little Home Sprouts Wings

Ahepa Patriotic Hellenic Order

In my rather extensive travels, I have been asked by many people in nearly every city and community that I have been what is the Order of Ahepa. or what kind of organization this is.

This question has been asked me by many citizens in this community, and I am very glad to state publicly what the order of Ahepa is.

The Order of AHEPA — American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association—it is a Hellenic Fraternity and its' membership comprized of American citizens or those who are willing to become American citizens.

Founded in Atlanta, Georgia, on July 26th, 1922 by a small group of American citizens of Hellenic descent, who after the world war saw the downfall of a number of nations on the European Continent, and the formation of dictatorships, communism, Hitlerism, Bolshevism, Fascism and what not form of government.

This small group of six members saw the d anger knocking at the door of our country, and the form of our democratic government who felt that the Greek who was residing in the United States was capable, by reason of his inherent qualities, of taking a more active part in the social, political, economic and educational life of the nation, thus becoming a useful and constructive

citizen of his adopted country on the one hand, and on the other maintaining the ideals and traditions associated with his ancestors.

Moreover, it was felt that the part played by the Hellenic people in American life was not generally known to the American public, and some medium was needed to bring them into closer contact and cooperation with their neighbors and fellow citizens of native birth

Obviously, some form of organization was essential in order to accomplish this purpose.

The order of AHEPA was the result, which, over 350 chapters are functioning, and grown to many thousands of members loyal to the United States Government and to the Fraternity.

The objects of the AHEPA are

1. To promote and encourage loyalty to the United States of America, allegiance to its flag, support to its constitution, obedience to its laws and reverence for its history and traditions; to instruct its members by precept and example in the tenets and fundamental principles of government; to instill in every member a due appreciation of the privilege of citizenship and the sacred duties connected with it, and to encourage its members to be interested in the poiltical, civic, social and commercial fields of human endeavor and always to strive for the betterment of society.

2. To promote in the United States a better and more comprehensive understanding of the Hellenic people and nation, and to revive, cultivate enrich and marshal into active service for America the noblest attributes and highest ideals of true

Hellenism.

3. To champion the cause of education, to suport the American system of public schools and to keep them free from religious prejudice; to promote and augment the educational advantages of this country and to establish and maintain new channels for disseminating culture and learning.

The AHEPA has adopted English as the official language of the organization. It requires by constitutional provision that applications for membership should be American citizens or at least that they should have filed their declaration of intention, the naturalization committee of each chapter being required to prepare and assist the declarants to complete their naturalization. It has sponsored lectures on American history and institutions. It has invited to membership prominent Americans whose personal contact with members of the organization has been instrumental in transmitting the spirit of Americanism, which cannot be engarved, photographed or otherwise portrayed on a certificate of naturalization. It has inspired the members with a genuine desire to understand their environment, to appreciate the opportunities open to them, and to assume as cheerfully the duties as they do the rights and privileges incident to American citizenship.

While the AHEPA is not essentially a benevolent order, it has, nevertheless, made substantial contributions to various charitable causes duing its existence, or rather since and mostly during the depression and up to the present in Some of which may be noted here. For schools in the United States,
