

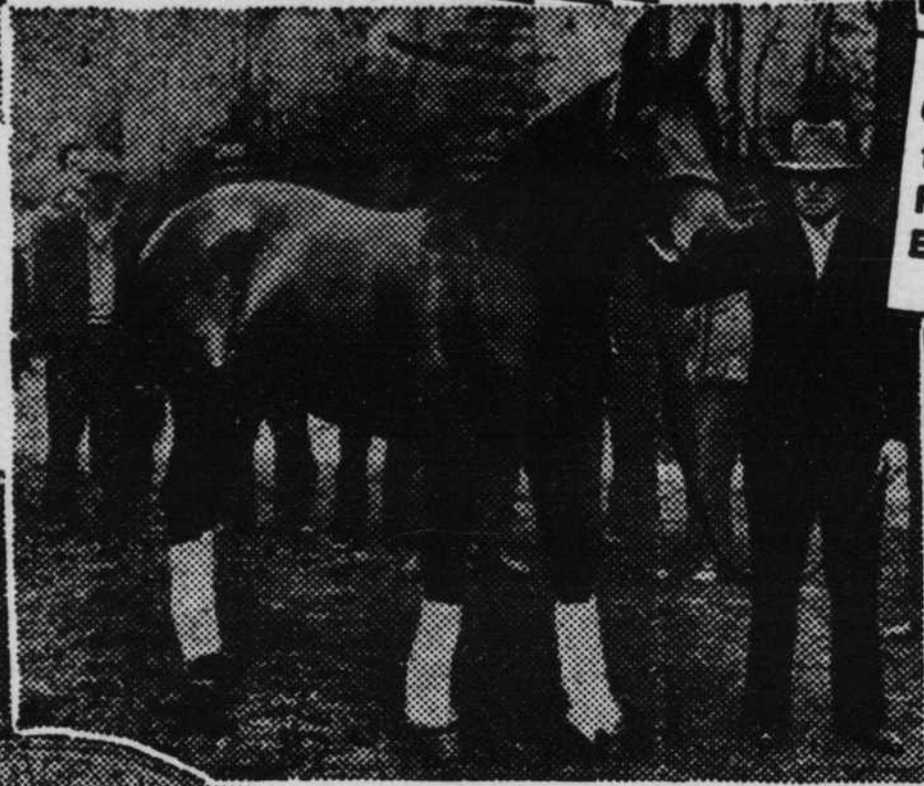
# In The WEEK'S NEWS

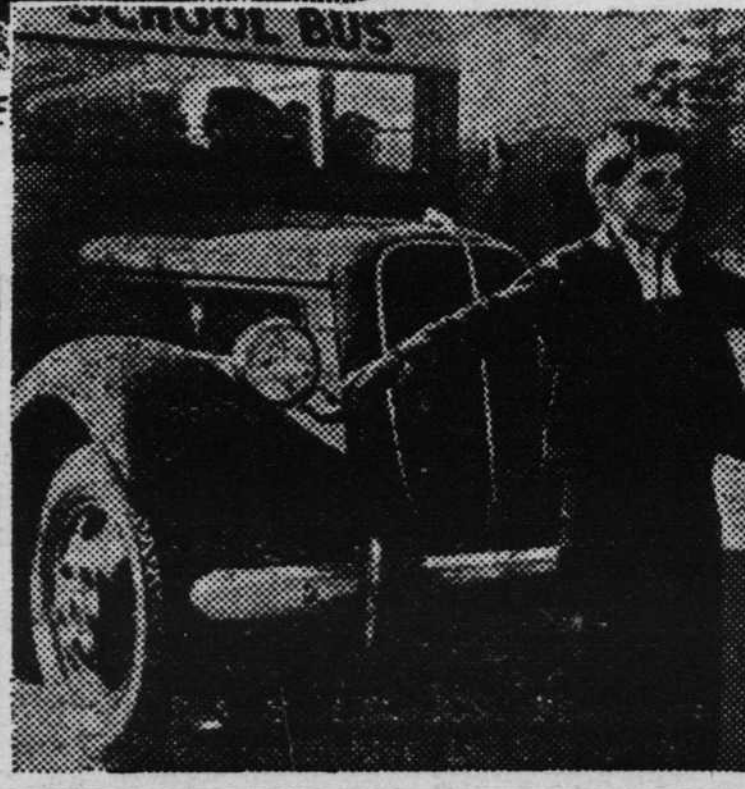
**GARGANTUA THE GREAT**—Giant gorilla featured this season by Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey Circus.

## To Wage Battle On Pine Beetle

The battle with the pine beetle to save the ponderosa and lumber pine in the Charleston mountain area, is now under way, according to Forest Ranger Anderson.

For the past two weeks men have been scouring the woods in Kyle and Lee Canyons, locating the trees in which these tiny insects are working.

Next week, the beetles thus located will be literally "boiled in oil," when fifty men begin the task of killing these beetles.

The process followed consists of: First, spotting or locating the infected trees; Second, felling these trees; Third, either piling and burning the trees by spraying the pile with fuel oil, or peeling the trees and then burning the bark in which the beetle lives.

This beetle hardly appears to be a killer although 62 trees were found last week in one group which are all doomed to death. He is only one-fourth of an inch long and looks very docile. He bores through the bark of the tree and then girdles it on the inside. A few thousand in one tree makes life look very dark to any tree.

When the eggs hatch and the mature beetles bore out and, in swarms, fly to other trees for an attack.

A healthy tree drowns the beetles in pitch, but a weak tree has little chance. The beetles must be trapped in the tree while in the egg or pupal stage in order for the battle to go against them.

The work is being done by men from Camp F-4 and is directed by the Forestry Service.

About 45,000 acres of timber lands on Charleston mountain are infected with these beetles. An average of three trees per 100 acres is estimated as the severity of the attack this year.

## Delegates Hurt In Auto Crash

Five persons enroute to the Episcopal Synod were injured Monday afternoon when a tire blow-out sent the car out of control causing it to roll over several times. The accident occurred about 40 miles north of Glendale on the Glendale-Alamo highway.

The accident was reported by Pete Pansey who was the first to pass the spot where the wreck occurred. He brought the two most severely injured to Las Vegas and police and highway cars from Las Vegas brought the others.

Those injured were: Rev. F. W. Weida of Ely; Rev. J. T. Knight of Pioche; Mrs. Edith Weeks of Wells; Deaconess Ommerod and Alma McQuarrie, the latter of whom had been picked up while walking the highway.

Rev. Weida and Alma McQuarrie were the most seriously injured and are in the hospitals of this city. The others suffered slight though painful injuries.
