

Realtors Will Study Business

Officers of the real estate board of this city and real estate leaders of the city and state will meet in Salt Lake City, June 6 and 7, for a great regional business conference on current real estate conditions.

The conference, first of its kind to be held in this region, will draw together national leaders in the real estate field and Realtors from the four states of the Southwest Region of the National Association of Real Estate Boards — California, Arizona, Nevada and Utah — with Realtors from Colorado, Wyoming, Idaho and New Mexico invited to take part.

Practical question of what to do and how to do it under today's conditions in the business of real estate make up the whole subject of the conference, which bankers and other financial groups, real estate owners, builders, and others interested in real estate questions are invited to attend.

Heading the conferees will be Joseph W. Catharine, Brooklyn, N.Y., president of the National Association of Real Estate Boards, D. D. Watson, Oakland, Calif., vice president of the Association for the Southwest region, who will preside at the three general sessions, and national and regional officers of the Association's great Institutes and Divisions covering the various specialized fields of real estate activity.

MINE LEASING CASE DECIDED BY COURT

A ruling in favor of the defendants in a suit instituted by John Lusetti and wife against Sam Robison, Lewis Mattice and N. H. Bowring over a lease on the Cuba mine in Steptoe Valley was delivered by the justice court in Ely last week.

Under terms of the lease, 30 shifts were to be put in on the mine each calendar month for five years. A clause providing that the requirement could be omitted if conditions made it impossible to do the work was carried.

When snow during the winter assertedly made it impossible to carry gasoline to the mine in February Mr. and Mrs. Lusetti sought a forfeiture order.

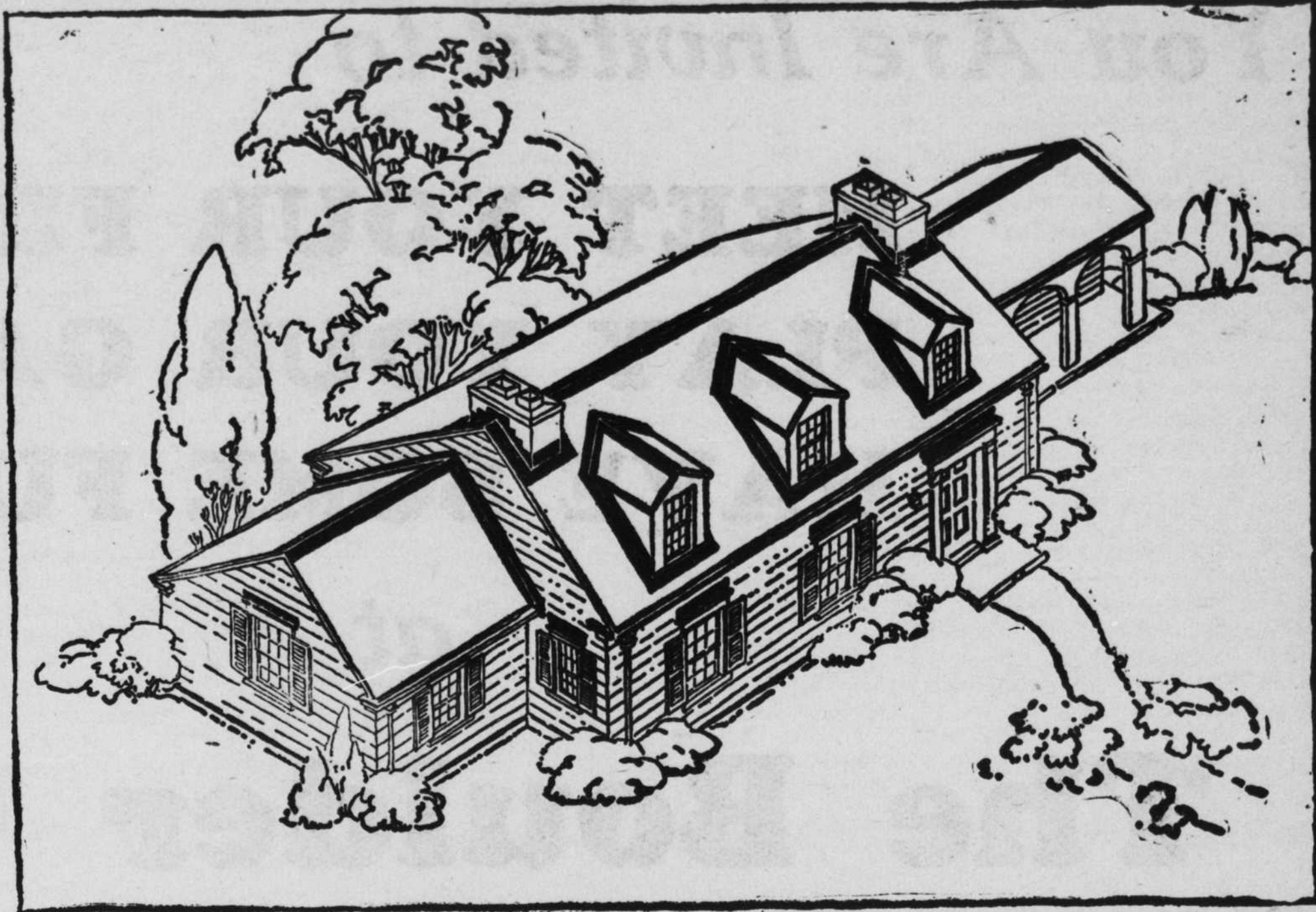

Protect Your House From Leaks



Leaks can result in stained walls and floors, falling plaster ceilings, damage to furnishings, and weakening of timbers. Proper flashing can prevent them. Flashing is needed when one roof surface intersects another, where chimneys and dormers project above or through the roof. Windows and doors need flashing particularly at the heads to make them watertight. If leaks have occurred recently at any point in your house, costly repair bills may result if proper flashing is not promptly installed. Work of this kind may now be financed by funds obtained from private financial institutions operating under the Property Improvement Credit Plan of the Federal Housing Administration.
