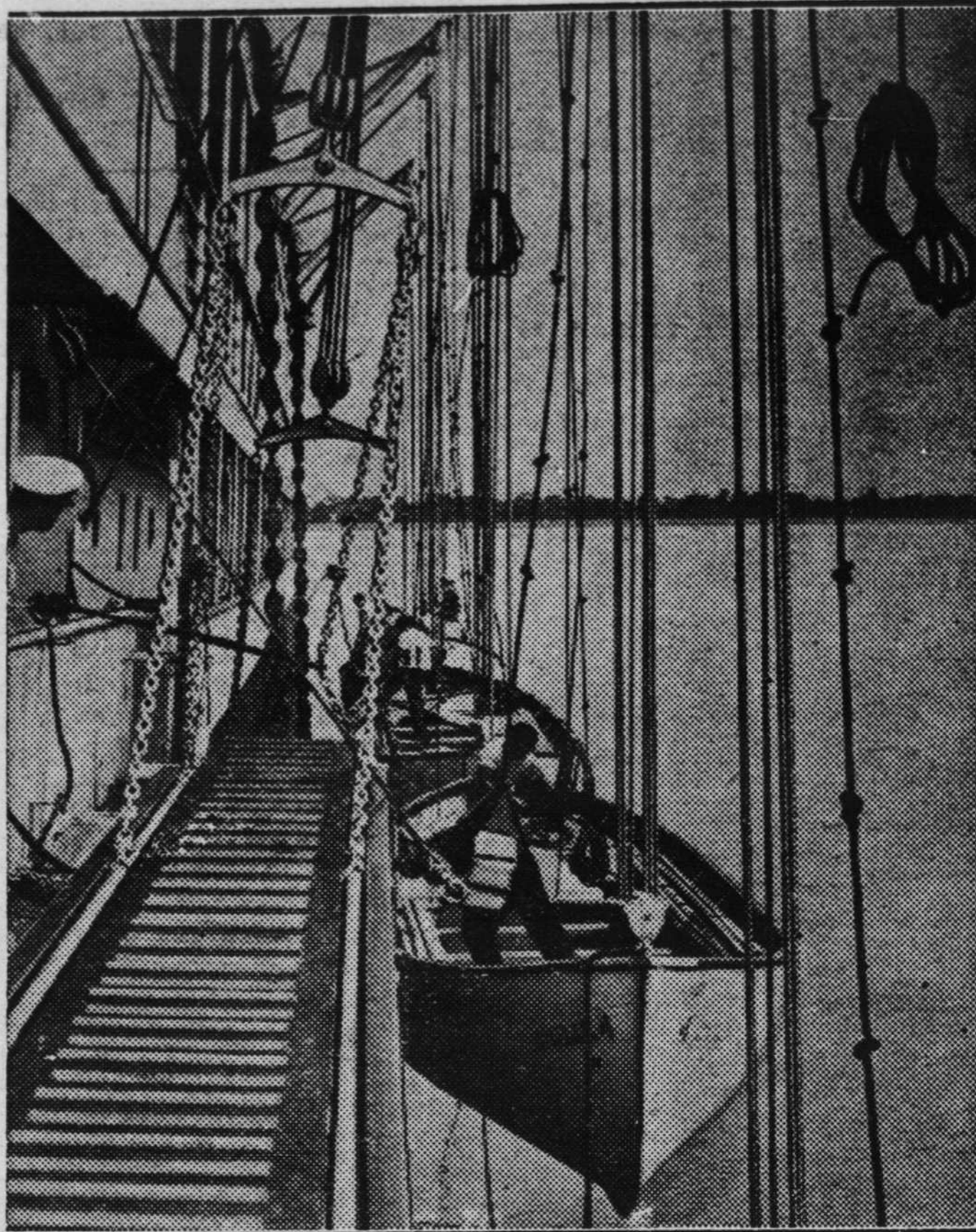
Rev. James was formerly Rector of this church but left Las Vegas in the year 1911.

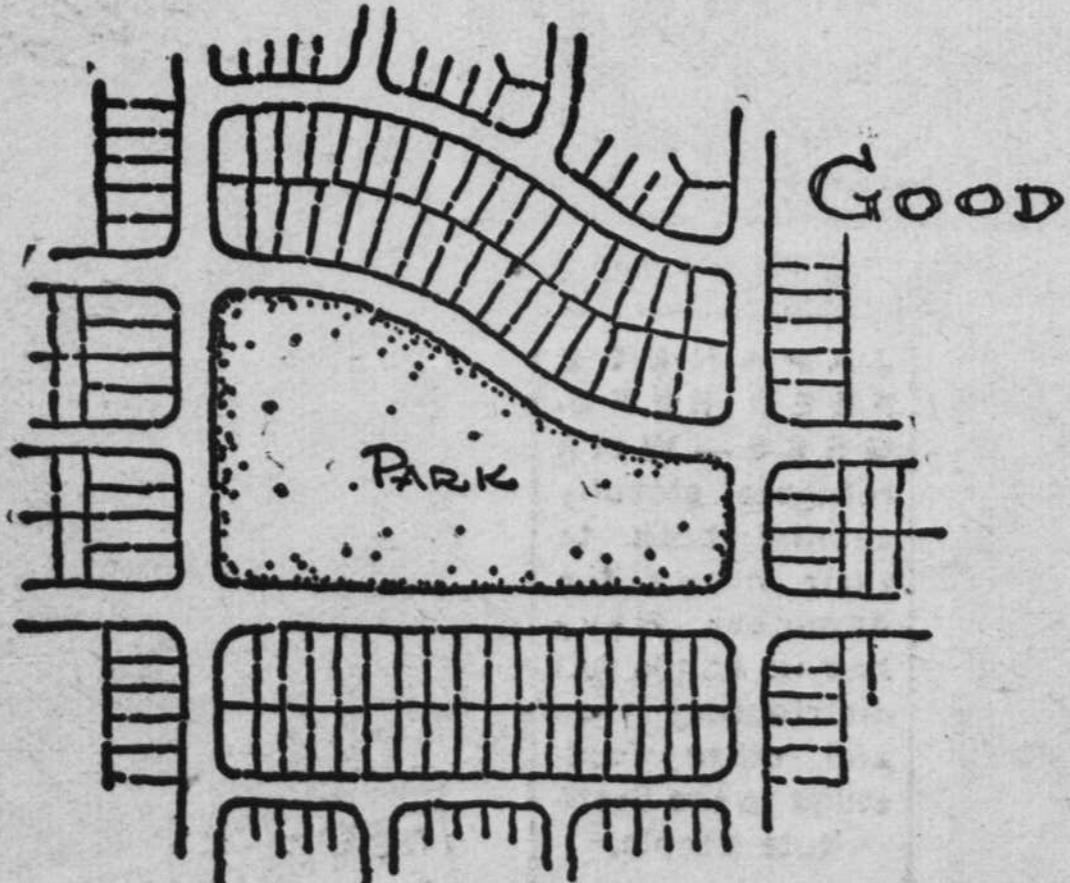
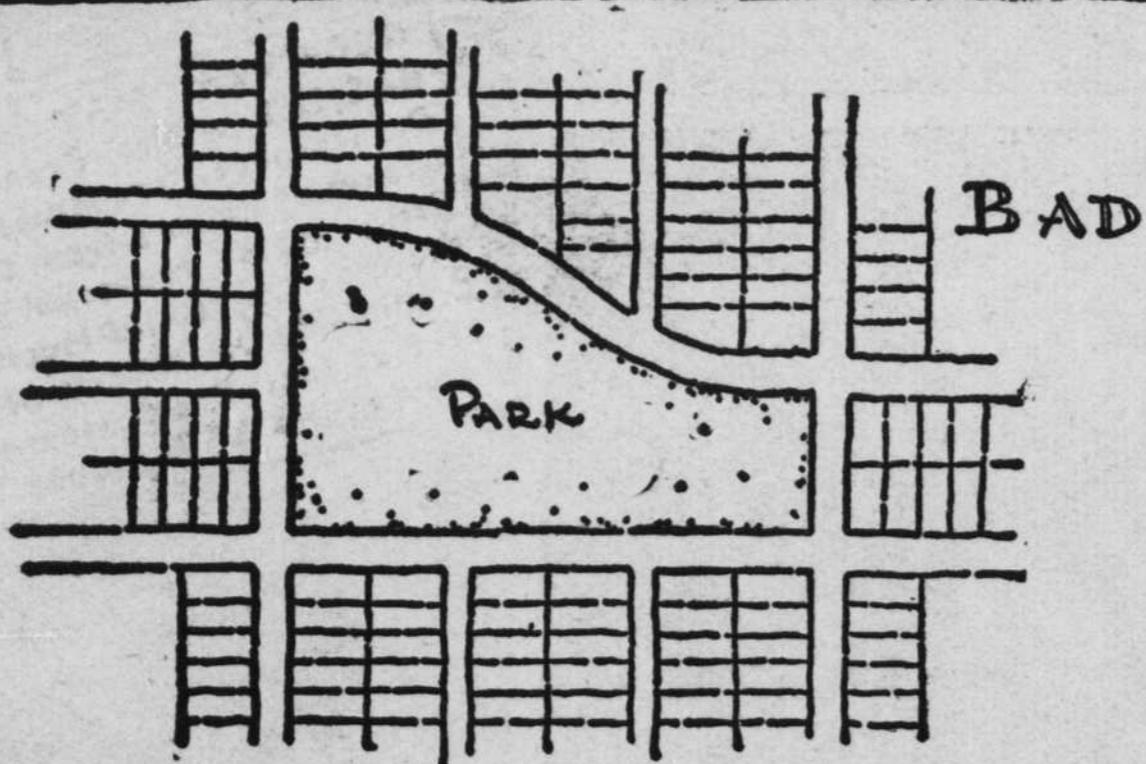
Those composing the party were Wally Williamson, Merl Emery, Bill Miller, Fred Monson, Jerry Crowe and Lou Meisner.

### LOTS SHOULD FACE DESIRABLE VIEWS

In laying out a subdivision the planner should take advantage of any natural or created beauty spot. Whenever possible lots should be so faced that houses will look out over the park rather than face on side streets. The above sketch shows how this can be done without upsetting the general plan of a subdivision and without curtailing the number of plots.

## Nye Firm Will Install Dredge

Construction work preparatory to installation of huge dredge on property of the Manhattan Gold Dredging company in Nye county is well under way according to the Tonopah Times-Bonanza. More than 25 men are employed on the project.

Work now being done includes installation of a pipe line, digging of a ditch for the pipe filling, pit excavation and installation of power and telephone lines.

The pipe line, 14 inches in diameter, is about half completed, end of the line now being the water source at Seylor's ranch and Manhattan. The pipe is being placed in the ground in 50-foot lengths and is joined and welded as work progresses.

Excavation for the pit for the dredge was started recently by the Dodge Construction company, and the dredges will be set in place later in the summer. The pit will be about 200 feet by 300 feet and ready for water within the next three weeks. Five yards of dirt are taken from the pit every minute, caterpillars and carry-alls being used.

Excavation for the pipe line is being handled by a machine ditch-digger and about two miles more of this work remains to be carried through all year.
