

Interim Work On Lander Hill

While awaiting the completion of plans for the summer development and production operations of the Austin Silver Mining Company, the work has been confined to the sampling of old dumps not hitherto sampled, to determine whether they can be profitably run through the mill and turned into concentrates.

The sampling of the Ruby dump has been completed but the assaying of the samples has not yet been finished. The Ruby dump which is one of the large dumps on Lander Hill is calculated to contain approximately 25,000 tons of material. It is situated high up on Lander Hill and consists of material taken out through the Ruby shaft. The Ruby shaft is an incline, extending down for a distance of 610 feet on the incline, from which extensive workings extend on a number of the rich veins of that area of Lander Hill, especially the strong and rich Farrell vein, one of the big producers of the camp of Austin.

The Great Eastern dump is now being sampled. This dump which is

also one of the big dumps, the Great Eastern shaft being one of the principal shafts of the production days of the camp, is located much lower down on Lander Hill and practically adjoins the Lincoln Highway, which is Main street, Austin, at the eastern side of the town on the north. The Great Eastern dump is estimated to contain approximately 20,000 tons or more of material hoisted to the surface through the Great Eastern shaft which extends vertically to a depth of 340 feet. This material resulted, for the most part, from operations on the celebrated rich Panamint vein in its upper levels.

Smelter returns have been received from a small shipment of very carefully selected ore from the 100-foot level of the Buffalo shaft of the Jack Pot mine made at the end of April. The ore was settled for by the smelter on the basis of the richest content of 1.53 ounces ounces of gold and 168.53 ounces of silver to the ton. The ore was taken out by J. R. Sibbald and Al Britto, leasers.

A larger shipment was made by the same leasers this week. This is, however, of less closely sorted ore and is not expected to show as high values.
