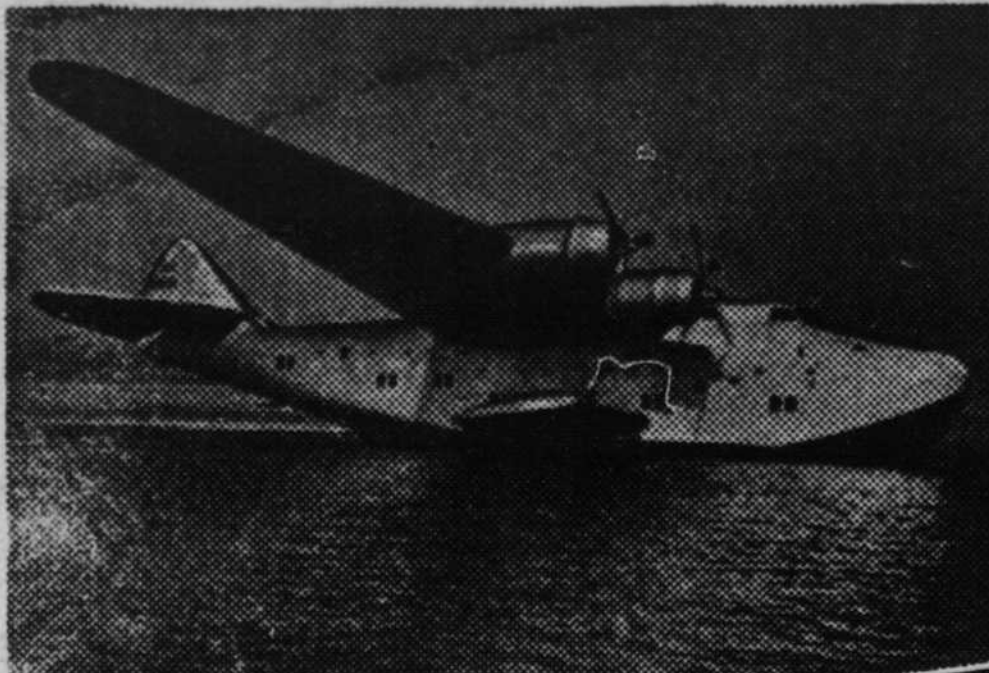
No one has come forth yet to oppose Dave Farnsworth for Recorder and Auditor. Farnsworth tends to his duties—and will be a hard man to beat.
