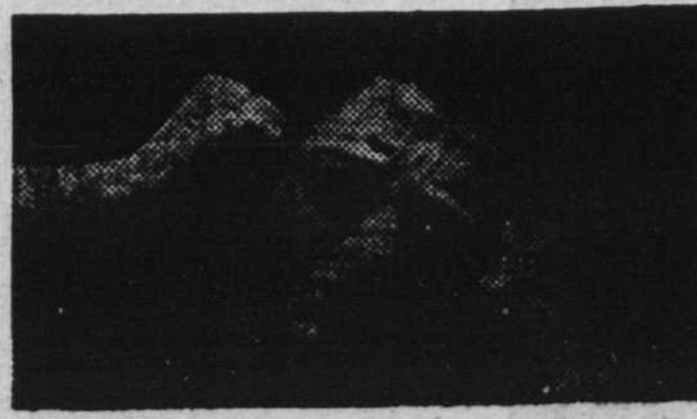

**Appoints Woman
Department Head**

Women might be better railroaders than men.

So W. M. Jeffers, president of the Union Pacific Railroad has named Avis Lodbell, special representative of the president, to head a special women's department with headquarters at Los Angeles.

"Extensive research shows that 60 to 70 per cent of railroad passengers are women," Jeffers explained in announcing the creation of another innovation in modern railroading.

"Some time ago we realized the need for particular attention to women travelers and inaugurated special coaches for the exclusive use of women and young children on our Challenger trains. As a result of this first step we have learned more and more the importance of specializing travel for women," Jeffers continued, "and we are establishing a woman's department of the Union Pacific with more than 60 trained women making up its personnel."

As a girl Miss Lodbell discarded dolls to play railroad and as she grew to womanhood tried her hand with a stage stock company and later began her career as a newspaper woman. In 1916 she was appointed one of four women passenger agents for the Union Pacific and rapidly climbed the ladder of responsibility and promotions until she was made special representative of the executive vice president in November, 1935. This latter position brought her in closer association with women and her wide travel experience won her the new promotion and duties held by no other

woman in the United States.

She is a member of both the International and National Federation of Business and Professional Women and she is a member of the Soroptimist Club.

Miss Mabel Reed has been appointed to assist Miss Lodbell at Los Angeles.
