Much Money For Paralysis Fight

Grand totals of the 1938 "Fight Infantile Paralysis" campaign show that the net receipts soared to \$1,-160.366.53 while disbursements for expenses were \$139,331.98.

The figures were made public by Keith Morgan, chairman of the Committee for the Celebration of the President's Birthday. They are from an audit of the campaign funds, as of July 1, just completed by Haskins and Sells, certified public accountants.

Uniting the fight against the "maining death" on a nation-wide scale for the first time the campaign hung up new records on all fronts, Chairman Morgan said.

The funds for the new National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, of which Mr. Basil O'Connor, New York attorney and former law partner of President Roosevelt, is president, now total \$1,021,034.55.

The audit shows these prinsipal items:

1. Receipts from celebrations of the President's Birthday received at headquarters totaled \$915,928.78.

2. The "March of Dimes" campaign which through radio broadcasts brought a flood of silver coins to the White House, raised the next highest amount—\$81,073.65.

3. Other contributions, including sales of Founders certificates at \$1, \$2 and \$5 each brought \$80,446.65 for the National Foundation.

4. Labor groups under the leadership of William Green, president of the American Federation of La-

or, raised a net sum of \$43,949.82 through greetings of workers sent to President Roosevelt at the White House.

5. The Western Union and the Postal Telegraph companies, by means of birthday greetings delivered at the White House at 25 cents each, raised \$19,967.62. The telegraph companies transmitted these greetings and collected and delivered the receipts entirely without cost, every cent contributed going into the fund.

6. Funds turned over to the new National Foundation for development of the nation-wide fight on the disease totaled \$19,000.00.

Thus of the total receipts of \$1,-160.366.53, the sum of \$244,437.74 was raised by activities other than birthday celebrations.

The "March of Dimes" campaign actually poured into the White House in ten days a pile of dimes equal in amount to six per cent of all the dimes coined by the U. S. mint in the last six months. Treasury records show there were 13,473 .-118 dimes coined in the past half


