**Four-Aichers Are Ready For Tahoe**

Several hundred Nevada 4-H Club boys and girls this week began final preparations for the Annual Nevada Junior Farm Bureau Camp which opens next Monday (August 1) at "Skyland," new Four-Aitcher campground on Lake Tahoe near Zephyr Cove.

Stimulated by the prospects of a new and greatly improved outing site, the youngsters, representing every agricultural county in the state, are putting in the final licks in preparing for the state championship contests and exhibits and otherwise getting ready for the week at Tahoe.

Although a quota limiting the number from each county who may attend has been set, the enrollment is expected by Camp Director Thomas Buckman of the University of Nevada Agricultural Extension Service, which sponsors the camp, to run about that of recent years.

With additional and more extensive facilities at "Skyland," former camp for Pacific coast boys of more privileged families, this year's camp in its outing activities, Buckman anticipates a 1938 camp superior to any ever held in the state.

Otto Schultz, Extension Soil Conservationist, and Miss Gertrude Hayes, Washoe county home demonstration agent, will serve as assistant camp directors, while Mrs. Florence Bovett, secretary of the Nevada State Farm Bureau, will act as song leader, and Dr. George Magee of Yerrington will be camp physician.
