**Divide Strike
 Big Attraction**

(Goldfield News & Weekly Tribune)

Daily assay returns from the min-
 ers working in the Divide district,
 twenty miles north of Goldfield in
 Esmeralda county, bear out early
 assertions that there is the making
 of a real mine base right at Gold-
 field's doorstep.

Joe Clifford made the original
 discovery, since which a number of
 experienced miners have taken up
 claims and leases, practically all of
 which show fabulous values.

Clifford, who made the strike two
 weeks ago, has received assay re-
 turns from the strike running as
 high as \$3,600 per ton in picked
 samples. Other assays taken from
 the 20-foot shaft and along the vein
 near the surface, have returned as
 high as \$600 per ton, predominately
 in gold.

J. W. Van Winkle, who holds a
 lease on the ground approximately
 500 feet west of the Clifford strike,
 Wednesday received an assay re-
 turn from a sample taken across a
 15-inch face running \$176 per ton.
 The Van Winkle vein is not believed
 to be a continuation of the Clif-
 ford strike but an entirely new
 structure, indicating that the en-
 tire area will show exceptional val-
 ues. Van Winkle is sinking a shaft
 and has opened the vein to a depth
 of three feet. The 15 inches, how-
 ever, carry the high grade values,
 although the remaining two feet
 pan free gold and is considered
 excellent shipping ore.

R. T. Morris, holding a lease 300
 feet to the east of the Clifford
 workings, received a return which
 assayed \$33.60 per ton. The Morris
 assay is reported to be approx-
 imately one-half gold and one-half
 silver. The Morris strike is a con-
 tinuation of the Clifford vein, it is
 believed.

Approximately fifteen sets of
 leasers are working on the ground
 and all are panning gold it was
 stated. Harry Bergman, who has
 a lease south of Clifford, is believed
 to have an exceptionally rich
 outcropping although assay returns
 have not been received.

Clifford is continuing to sack his
 highgrade ore and expects to make
 a shipment soon. He is confining
 his work at the present time to
 exploring the length of the vein
 and sacking from near the surface.

E. J. Roberts, noted mining en-
 gineer, employed by the Verdi Di-
 vide to plot the ground and divide
 the area into lease blocks, has been
 on the ground for the past two
 days and said that he is particular-
 ly impressed with the showings and
 predicted an ore body of consider-
 able size. Also on the property are
 A. L. Parker, president of the com-
 pany and his son-in-law, G. C.
 Brockman. Parker and Brockman
 are Los Angeles residents and ex-
 pect to spend considerable time in
 the district.
