Wm. I. Smyth, president, announces that Daniel C. Jackling will be guest of honor at a meeting of the Nevada Section of the American Institute of Mining Engineers to be held at McGill on Saturday, September 17th.

Mr. Jackling is President of the A. I. M. E. for the year 1938, and is on a tour officially visiting the various local sections of the Institute. He will be accompanied by Mr. A. B. Parsons of New York Secretary of the Institute.

Mr. Jackling has earned an important place in mining and financial circles, being one of the leading mining engineers of the world.
