

Dog Show Set For Sun Valley

SUN VALLEY, Idaho — Dog Fan- ciers in the middle west, the west and some in eastern points have been invited to take part in the elaborate all breed bench dog show and retriever trials to be held at Sun Valley, October 10 and 11 by the Idaho State Field Trial Association as part of its fourth annual affair which winds up with pointer and setter field trials at Gooding, Idaho, October 12, 13 and 14, according to officials of the organization.

Officials believe that at least 300 dogs of almost 40 breeds will be exhibited at the Sun Valley bench show, some of them from the finest dog breeders of the west and east.

Superintendent of the bench show will be George M. Bingham of Portland. Henry Oppenheimer and Mrs. Geo. M. Bingham of Portland will judge the exhibit, Mrs. Bingham specializing on toy breeds. Retriever trials, in which Chesapeake Bays, Labradors and Irish Spaniels are eligible, will be judged by Drexel H. Brown of Portland and Jack Tingey of Buhl, Idaho.

All retrieving dogs will be required to work on both land and water. The trials will include a novice stake, open to dogs that have never won open stakes, and amateur handlers stake, open to dogs of any retriever breed or age handled by a non-professional. In this a special trophy will be awarded the best Idaho owned dog. There is also an all-age retriever stake. In both days field trials will be staged in the mornings, bench show in the afternoon.

The two days show will close with a banquet at the Challenger Inn at which time awarding of trophies will take place. There will be almost two hundred prizes and ribbons awarded, and all wins in both bench and field events are fully accredited by the American Kennel Club.

Included in list of retriever trial contestants from the east will be W. A. and Roland Harriman of New York, who will enter their well known string of Labradors.

Honors Go To Nevada Bank

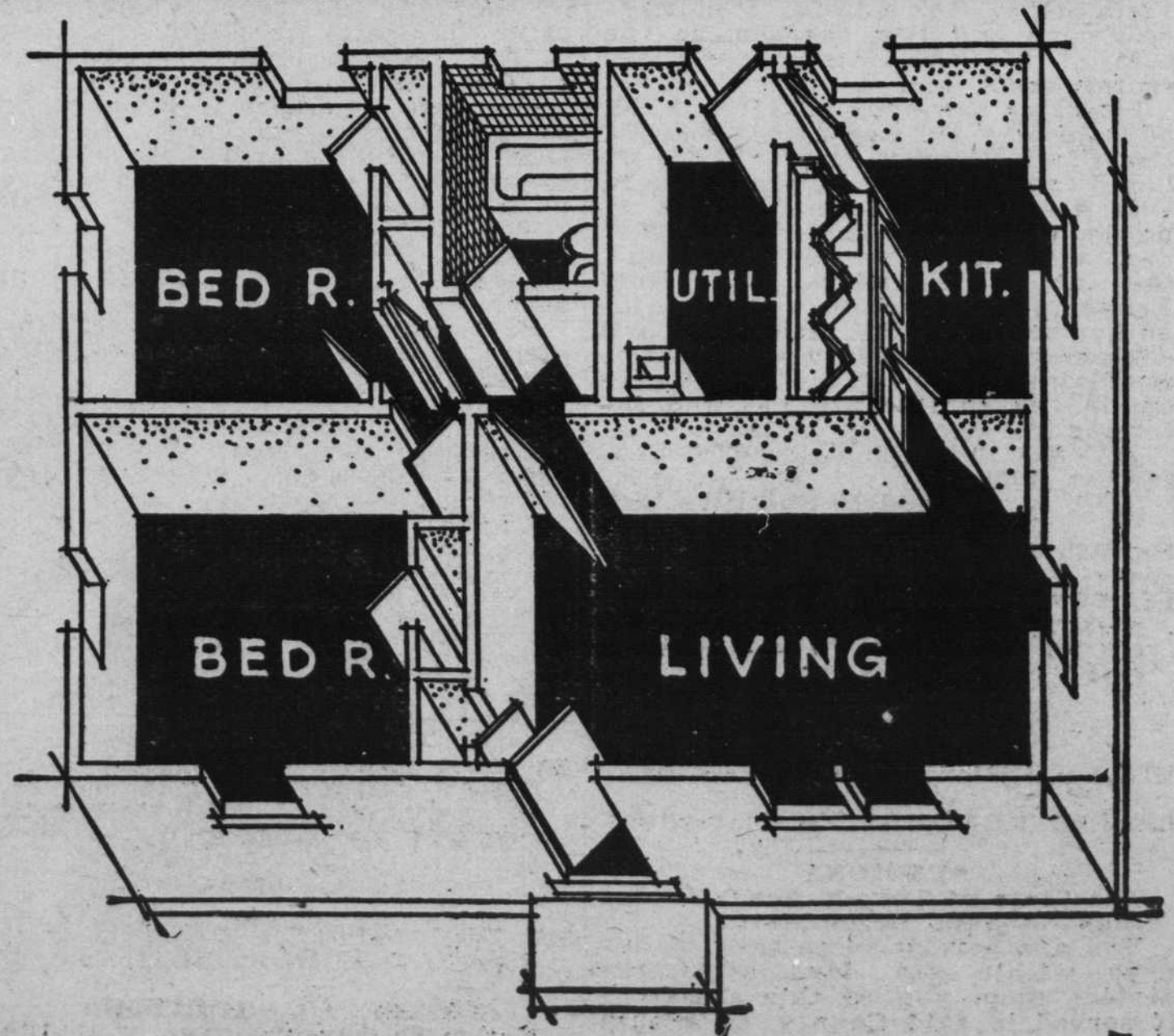
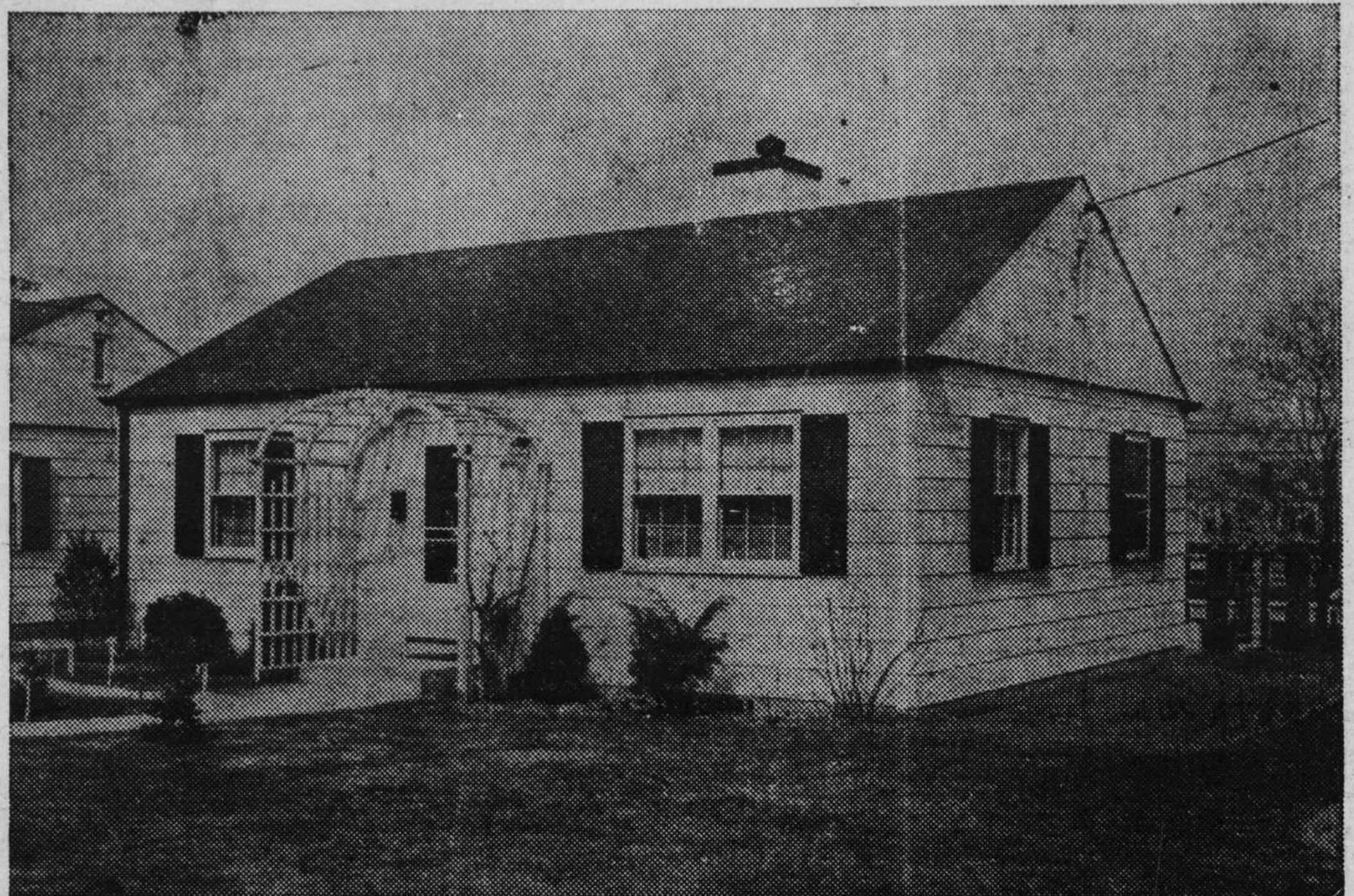
President Roosevelt says that Senator George is his good friend. Wonder if he is thinking about the same kind of friends when over the radio he calls us "my friends."
