Miss Edna Bush spent several days the past week in Los Angeles.

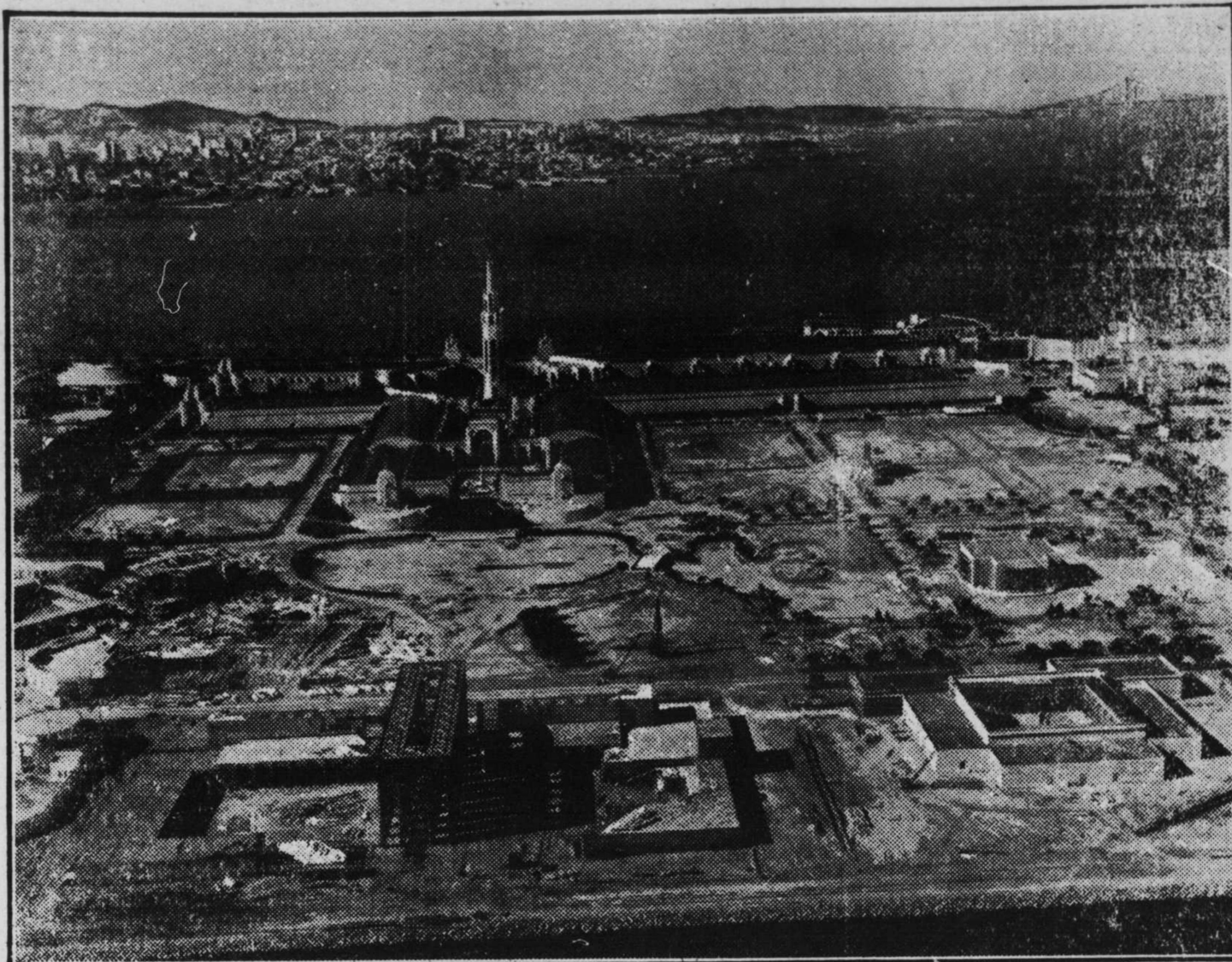
S. Gene Parks has returned from a visit with relatives in the East.
