

### Nevada Ski Team Ready for Season

### Union Pacific to Assist Campaign Against Paralysis

Participation by the Union Pacific railroad in President Roosevelt's campaign against infantile paralysis was announced today by W. M. Jeffers, president of the Union Pacific.

In a letter to all officials, general agents and station masters throughout the eleven states in which the railroad operates, Mr. Jeffers requested that local chairmen of the president's birthday ball be advised of the railroad's plan to cooperate.

President Jeffers said that not only would envelopes, addressed to The President, Washington, D. C., and so constructed as to permit the inspection of coins and bills, be distributed on all Union Pacific trains, but that local committees will be permitted to place in all Union Pacific stations coin containers in which the public may deposit their contributions.
