This proneness to boasting of Las Vegas' climate is nothing new with this Observer. In the Carson City News of March, 1911, was the following:

"Charles P. Squires, editor of the Las Vegas Age, is in this city from the southern city and is a guest of Governor Oddie. Mr. Squires brought with him from Las Vegas a large box of peach, apricot and almond blossoms from the trees of his home land, which are a welcome sight for us of the snow and mud."

"Mr. Squires was an interested spectator at the legislature (assembly) yesterday when the measure was going through that body which tended to incorporate the city of Las Vegas under the Des Moines commission plan. He says that there is only one place in the state of Nevada where the sun shines always, the flowers never cease to bloom and the birds are always in foliage and that spot is Las Vegas. We excuse him for the simple fact that he is biased in his opinion."

At a dinner given by Governor Oddie at The Mansion to a group of members of the legislature, the almond blossoms were placed on the table in large vases. As the evening warmed up bees came out of the bunches of blossoms and zoomed fiercely about the heads of the guests, causing a near riot which almost broke up the party.

Issue Warnings on Winter Driving

The safety division of the state department of highways has issued a cautionary warning asking all motorists to reduce speed and take extraordinary precautions while driving during the winter weather.

Ice and snow have formed many slick spots all over the state. These are dangerous especially when struck at high speed. While the department maintenance crews have sanded many of these places to reduce the danger, the element of hazard in slipping still remains.

The safety division's warning points out particularly the danger of fast driving over such highways as the Reno-Carson route which, under normal conditions, can be safely traveled at between 50 and 60 miles per hour. Adverse weather has changed the situation completely and speeds should be reduced and maintained at a lower rate than that practiced during normal driving conditions. Ice patches loom up ahead suddenly and when struck at high speed throw the motor car completely out of control. Danger also arises when cars build up their speeds on dry stretches and are suddenly confronted with an icy curve or hill.

On other highways, in all parts of the state, where snow and ice conditions prevail, it is strongly recommended that speeds do not exceed 45 to 50 miles per hour. Within city limits and particularly at intersections the maximum speed should be held down to as low as 15 miles per hour.

Study and experience in other sections of the country have fully determined that these suggested limitations afford the greatest safety factor during winter driving, and highway department officials urge all drivers of motor cars to give their full cooperation and closely observe these speed limitations.

Chronicle Features Elko City and County

Elko, county and city, were the featured attractions of a Western Pacific advertisement in Sunday's Diamond Jubilee edition of the San Francisco Chronicle.

The "ad" appeared on the front page of the Jubilee section of the paper, and was headed by the caption in large letters, "Elko's Dogies."

Beneath a line drawing of a yearling the advertisement features the W. P. "Exposition Flyer," and states that it "makes one of its five stops at Elko, the largest Nevada city on the line. Elko means 'beautiful.' It is headquarters of Humboldt forest and center of the great cattle and sheep raising country."—Elko Free Press.

Typographical Union Endorses General Hospital

Whereas, we seem to have reached the stage in Clark County that any person needing medical attention must be of more than moderate means, or else of no means at all, to get hospital care when he needs it. Trafficking in human illness seems to be too profitable to allow the relinquishment of any part of it.

And whereas, it seems inconsistent to us that in an American democracy the person who is still striving in his small way for independence and self-support of himself and family should have the floor pulled out from under him whenever he cannot attain wealth and will not consent to become a pauper.

And whereas, the Clark County Hospital has been barred by court restraining order from accepting pay patients, or anyone except needy who have no relatives or friends capable of helping them. This also leaves some physicians with no hospital to which they can take pay patients at any time.

Therefore, we endorse the plan of a Clark County General Hospital in which all physicians may practice, and all patients, needy, rich and poor, may receive hospital care when it is required.

Excessive use of brakes because of too much speed is hard on brake bands and tires and often results in dangerous skids.

IMPROVED HIGHWAYS GAINED LAST YEAR

More than 17,000 miles of highway of all types were completed in the United States during the 1939 fiscal year, an increase of 1,800 miles over the previous year, reports the Automobile Club of Southern California.

A total of 382 grade crossings were eliminated and 438 crossings were protected by signals and other devices.
