REPORT SHOWS FEDERAL PRISONS ARE OVERCROWDED

To deal with the situation Mr Bennett recommended a broad, long range building program. As it is many prisoners are confined in improvised quarters located in warehouses, basements and hallways.

Since 1930, the report stated, the federal prison population has increased 57.3 per cent, and if the rise continues the Government will have in custody 5,190 more prisoners than it can take care of by 1943.

In explaining the increases, Mr. Bennett pointed out that during 1938 alone there were 1,259 convictions for federal laws passed since March 4, 1933. From 1937 to 1938, the average sentence also increased from 14.7 months to 16.5 months, and is another factor that has boosted prison population.

For many years the regular federal prisons at Atlanta and Leavenworth have housed twice as many prisoners as they were constructed to handle

During the last fiscal year, fortyfour convicts escaped from the temporary quarters set up to take care of the extra prisoners. Thirty were recaptured. No one escaped from a regular federal prison, though five tried to break out of Alcatraz in January, 1939. All were recaptured within half an hour.

It is suggested by outside observers that one of the best methods of tackling the overcrowded situation
