(Continued from Page One) should be guilty of murder in the first degree, and that conclusion I deduce from the evidence introduced, and I believe that's your opinion, and that verdict should be arrived at very shortly after you retire for your deliberations. There shouldn't be any question in anyone's mind about that if you follow the instructions of the Court and i you feel inclined to do your duty the same as you would expect others to perform theirs in similar circumstances.

"As to the question of punish ment, as indicated by the instruction of the Court, it is optional with the jury to give either life imprisonment or fix the penalty of death and that's within your exclusive power. Whatever I may say on the subject you may disregard, as well as whatever Mr. McNamee may say on the subject. It will take a great deal of serious thinking on your part. As far as I am concerned if trict Court his final account of adyou bring in a first degree murder verdict, and if you feel the defendant should be sentenced by the judgment of the Court to life imprisonment, that's entirely satisfactory to me. I am not telling you what to do, and neither am I asking that you send the defendant to the gas house. 


