**BIDS WANTED FOR HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT**

**TO HELL WITH PUBLIC INTEREST**

In a signed editorial, Paul Bloch, publisher of the Pittsburgh Post, lays the blame for the lack of utility expansion squarely in the lap of the government.

"The production of electric energy in 1939," writes Mr. Bloch, "was 36 per cent greater than in 1929. . . In view of this increase, it would be expected that the public utility industry would expand, modernizing its existing plants, building new ones, creating jobs all down the line. . . Just the reverse has occurred. The public utilities, which spent \$525,000,000 in construction in 1929, spent only \$288,000,000 for this purpose in 1939 — a decrease of 45

per cent. The investment picture is much the same. Capital flotation for public utilities in 1929 was \$2,442,000,000, and in 1939 only \$1,261,000,000. And it must be added that a very large part of the latter figure was simply refinancing which brought no new capital into the field."

Mr. Bloch then observes that there is one very simple and direct answer to this apparent paradox—the fact that the political fight against the industry "has prevented expansion and driven off new capital."

Government spokesmen have condemned the utilities for not spending more and thus aiding recovery, when every conceivable step has been taken, apparently with malice aforethought, to make it difficult for the industry to attract new capital. Not long ago, the SEC actually denied one of the best private operating utilities in the country the right to issue bonds for new capital, informing it that it must issue stock instead — thus doubling its interest costs.

It has become abundantly clear that the "power politicians" are less interested in recovery, less interested in helping create jobs, in raising the national purchasing power, than they are in socializing the utility industry. There's the issue, bluntly and frankly. Teh utilities, once socialized, would constitute a great new field for political patronage

and power. So the socialization drive goes ruthlessly on — and the "to hell with the public interest" policy goes on with it.
