WOMAN IN POLITICS

Life is added to a dragging political campaign by the advent of Clare Booth—colorful war correspondent, author, magazine writer, etc.—as Republican candidate for Congress in Connecticut. This eloquent young lady at least knows what is going on in the world and, regardless of party allegiance, may stir up a sluggish House if she reaches Washington.

"We know tonight, as we stand here," she says, "that the walls of this hall shut out a horrible vision of human suffering. All over the world, with every tick of the clock, hundreds of people are dying. Everywhere, as we talk, men are maiming, mutilating, burning, and blasting each other into eternity. Women are being buried with their babies in their arms, under the ruins of their bombed homes. Whole peoples grow sunken-eyed, bare-boned, rickety, easy prey to pestilence, fever, famine. And with every breath we take in some starved child breathes its last."

"I think that we had better make a pledge to the dead. To those who do not see, but who are listening. To the spirits of all those killed at Pearl Harbor and after, our pledge is this: They shall not have died in vain. We pledge them total victory, which is not only the military defeat of their enemies but a just and fruitful peace and a better world for their children. The future of their children is the only stake that our American dead have left in their country now."

Hardly less vital is her practical plea; "see to it that the two-party system survives, for political liberty boils down to a very simple idea: have two big parties. Criticize government policies, she urges, but give total support to the president in his final decisions. For "if our Commander-in-Chief fails in the two years ahead, America fails.—Ely Daily Times.

BLACKOUT

The term is descriptive of what is happening in the world today. Blackout means much more than doing without artificial light. It is a symbol of the gradual destruction of human advancement. It means the breaking up of families, the death of millions of innocent people, the destruction of a free education and religious system. It is the forerunner of a type of government that makes slaves of all the people it touches.

Blackout symbolizes the end of civilization as we have known it. It is an ominous world. In a country like ours, imagination cannot conceive of the terror that follows in its wake. Blackout is the forerunner of a new type of enemy invasion that wherever successful, actually does blackout, or wipe out individual identity, opportunity, savings, family relations—for the children become mere pawns of the state—freedom of speech, freedom of worship, private enterprise—everything that symbolizes America.

The fact that large sections of this nation are now living under dim-out and blackout regulations is a warning—an ominous shadow of what we face if we do not crush the forces that have caused almost a total blackout of the rest of the world.

There would be little labor trouble, or production trouble, or politics-as-usual if the people could visualize what blackout means. Its mere shadow should be enough to cement this nation into one irremediable unit of opposition.—Goldfield News.

should be borne by these cabinet members in these times, in order to take that load off the shoulders of the commander-in-chief, for whom it is humanly impossible to bear not only his own duties but those he is presently bearing for the weak and inefficient members of his present cabinet.

8. We condemn the absurd and ridiculous rationing of sugar, done at tremendous expense, and the wasting of the time of thousands of good Americans, when sugar is rotting where produced, the warehouses bulging to over-capacity, and the government actually has paid out millions of dollars to farmers not to produce it. We fledge our willingness to accept the rationing of any article necessary or even advisable for the war effort, but refuse to insult the intelligence of the American people by such an attempt as sugar rationing to make them war conscious when such rationing is absolutely unnecessary. The American people are entirely war conscious and it would be well for the congress of the United States not only to realize that but to be as war conscious as the people they are supposed to represent.

9. In this mining state of Nevada we unhesitatingly condemn the large talk about financing operations for the production of critically needed strategic metals, and the red-tape, inefficiency, and unparadonable delays which have prevented, in a great majority of the cases, any government assistance and aid to these essential industries. We shall cut the red-tape, provide the assistance, and begin the production forthwith.

10. In this mining state of Nevada, with its millions of tons of iron ore, known, located, and tested, we condemn unhesitatingly the failure of the New Deal congress to act promptly, efficiently, and intelligently toward the production of the countless tons of pig iron which could be produced, while wasting the time, efforts, and enthusiasm of millions of loyal Americans in the collection of the temporary stop-gap of scrap iron. We shall put these mines in operation, build the necessary furnaces, and produce all the iron which can possibly be used toward the winning of the war.

11. We demand a congress patriotic enough, loyal enough, to meet problems involving political expediency with courage and unselfishness, and thereby to take that load off the shoulders of the president.

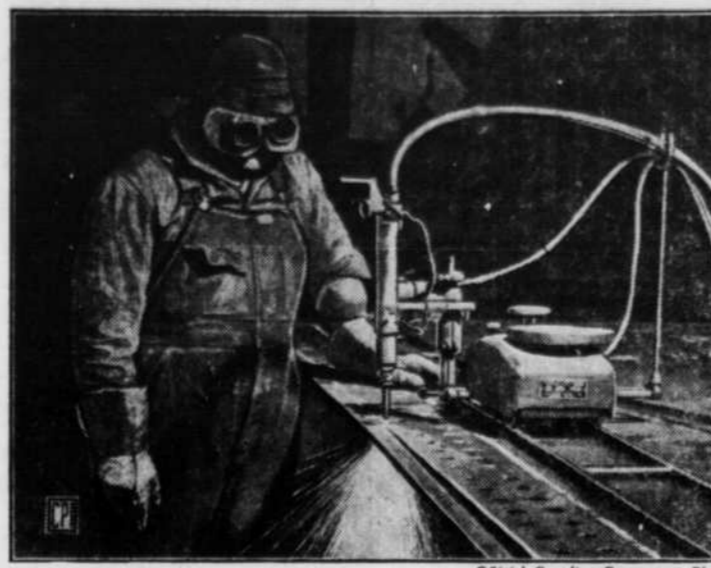
12. We condemn a feeble, selfish, and incompetent congress for their timidity, after being nine months in the war and not having produced and enacted a tax bill, thereby undermining the morale of the entire nation, which cannot make its plans toward the winning of the war until it knows what its tax bill will be. If a national sales tax is necessary and is to be enacted by this congress after elections, we demand it now. If a withholding tax is essential and is to be enacted after the elections by this congress, we demand it now. Our faith in the patriotism and loyalty of the American people is unbounded, and we know a nation which is giving up its fathers, mothers, sons and daughters and brag about how we took it in the pocketbook as well as on the chin.—Ely Daily Times.

13. We condemn the rivalry and jealousy existing between the countless bureaus, commissions, and bodies in Washington, which have resulted in inefficiency, waste, and failure to produce results, and in its stead pledge the abolition of most of these bureaus and commissions and the placing of authority in the hand of a single executive, chosen purely on the ground of ability and experience and regardless of party affiliations.

14. In this mining state of Nevada we believe that the production of strategic metals—which may mean the difference between winning or not winning the war—is of sufficient importance to grant to those who are now attempting to develop such products a right to amortize their investment before the imposition of prohibitive taxes.

Canadian Shipyards Deliver The Goods



In this photograph an automatic oxygen torch cuts through thick ship's plate in a West Coast Canadian shipyard where 10,000-ton cargo ships are built. Canada's shipbuilding program calls for an outlay of more than 550 million dollars. Merchant ships completed this year will equal the total for British shipyards. More than 150 10,000-ton freighters have been ordered, in addition to smaller cargo

vessels, corvettes, minesweepers patrol boats, crash boats and motor torpedo boats. Keels for two Tribal class destroyers have been laid in Canadian yards.

Besides all this construction 30 vessels have been equipped to defend themselves at sea, including three passenger ships now serving as auxiliary cruisers. The shipbuilding industry, composed of 17 major shipyards and 58 smaller boat yards employs more than 40,000 men.
