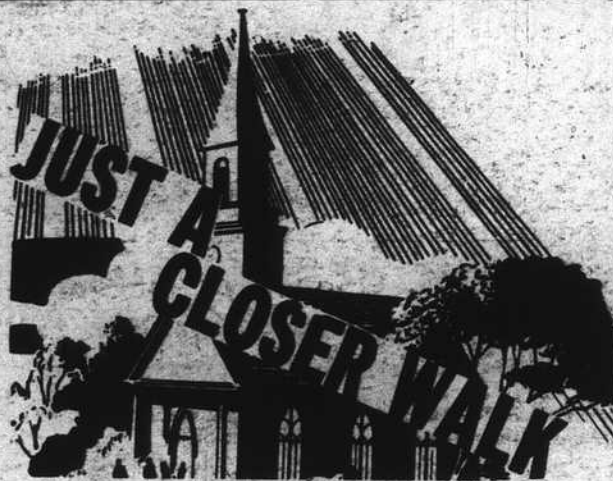

"A Little Prejudice"

By RABBI PRESSMAN

Part One of a sermon by Rabbi Pressman, delivered to the Congregation of Temple Beth AM, at Los Angeles, California on September 19, 1963. We hope that these words from the heart of Rabbi Pressman will reach the hearts of all who read them.

Dear Friends:

It was Sunday. It was "Youth Day" at the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, and the church was crowded with young people and with parents. The Sunday school class was discussing our Bible, using the text of the story of Joseph in Egypt, and how he forgave his brothers for selling him into slavery. They spoke of Joseph's emotional outburst, of how he cried on the shoulders of his brethren as he forgave them. They agreed that the American Negro should be equally ready to forgive the white community that had enslaved and oppressed him, and that frank and open exchange of thought should take place between the two groups. Suddenly the peaceful discussion was transformed into a nightmare as a terrifying explosion ripped the church, injuring twenty-three of the children, and murdering Addie Mae Collins, age 14, one of five children; Carol Robertson, age 14, one of three children; Cynthia Wesley, age 14, an only child; and Denise McNair, age 11, an only child.

Why does their story concern us today? Well, this is Rosh Hashanah... Hayom Harat Olam... Today is the birthday of the world, the anniversary of creation, and according to our Jewish tradition the whole of creation is not more important than the life of one of those little Negro girls in Birmingham. This we learned as long ago as the story of Adam's children, Cain and Able. "When Cain killed his brother Abel, though he shed the blood of one", we are taught in the Abot of Rabbi Nathan, "the Bible uses the word Damim, the plural of the word for blood; which teaches that the blood of all the children; and the children's children to the end of all generations destined to come forth from him and prevented by this murder from doing so, stood crying before the Holy One, blessed be He. Thus thou dost learn that ONE man's life is equal to all the work of creation."

It is important for us to remember this fundamental Jewish doctrine today, because the single most terrible danger facing this world in these times of revolutionary upheaval, is that we might lose sight of the incalculable value and the sacredness of every individual human being. If we ever do forget that one man's life is equal to the entire work of creation, then we cease to be human, and become instead a community of ants, climbing over one another in the mechanical performance of the bare essentials involved in staying alive.

What is this revolutionary upheaval? It confronts us wherever we turn. The splitting of the atom has presented us with the dilemma of unlimited power... unlimited power to destroy, and unlimited power to perform labor. Do you realize what it means that the supply of coal, oil, and water power can all be exhausted and the power of the atom will still supply unlimited power, so that there need be no poverty, no labor, no want? And coupled with this staggering dilemma is that of the revolution of the machine - the machine, programmed, automated to the point where it can even reproduce itself. You and I are only beginning to see the enormity of this revolution which will make man unnecessary for work, and work unnecessary for man. Add to these the unprecedented progress and revolution in all of the life-sciences, which are beginning to conquer the diseases, transplant organs, induce the population explosion, and create life in the test-tube. Add to these the revolution in man's exploration of space which will have representatives of the human race on the moon and beyond in our lifetime. And add to these the human revolution which sees the emergence of the colored peoples of the earth, not merely the twenty million in these United States, but the hundreds of millions in Asia, Africa, and South America. We who are so concerned if a neighborhood changes its complexion by the addition of some Negroes had better wake up and realize that we Caucasians are a vastly outnumbered minority, who must get along with all our neighbors or perish in a sea of blood in which it is scientifically impossible to distinguish the

blood of the white man from that of the colored man. Now every one of these simultaneous revolutions deals in huge masses of people and threatens to destroy the essential value and dignity of the individual human life. That is why it is so important for us to gather this Rosh Hashanah and reiterate our declaration three times as we blow the Shofar, "Hayom harat olam. This is the birthday of the world. Hayom ya-amid bamishpat kol y'tsurei olamim. This is the day every creature of all the worlds stands in judgment before Thee." That is why it is so important for us to realize the genius of our sages who selected Bible stories for us to read today which deal with individuals. You and I simply cannot grasp what it means to lose six million Jews, but we can understand the value of one Anne Frank, one Hannah Senesch. You and I cannot fathom the problems of the thousands of miners working in daily danger, but we can feel it when one or two miners are trapped and we will spend unlimited dollars to rescue even one. You and I cannot feel the hurt of twenty million American Negroes, but four dead young girls - that, we can understand. If the day ever comes that our
