LAS VEGAS LEGISLATIVE SEMINAR

The Nevada Council of Churches will conduct a two-day legislative seminar on Civil Rights, Mental Health, and Youth in Las Vegas Jan. 29 and 30. A Bonanza Airlines plane has been chartered for northern Nevada participants. The chartered plane will leave Las Vegas on the return flight to Reno at 9:00 p.m. Jan. 30.

Rev. Donald C. Thompson, pastor of the Campus Christian Association at the University of Nevada, Reno, is the discussion leader in the area of Civil Rights. Rev. Thompson has secured James H. Anderson, Chairman of the Las Vegas Branch NAACP Labor and Industry Committee, as one of the resource persons on Negro civil rights in southern Nevada. In addition to the legislative seminar, the Nevada Council of Churches will also hold its annual dinner meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Jan. 30. The Council was one of the active supporters of civil rights before the 1963 session of the State legislature. W. E. Clawson, Jr., is president of the Council.
